



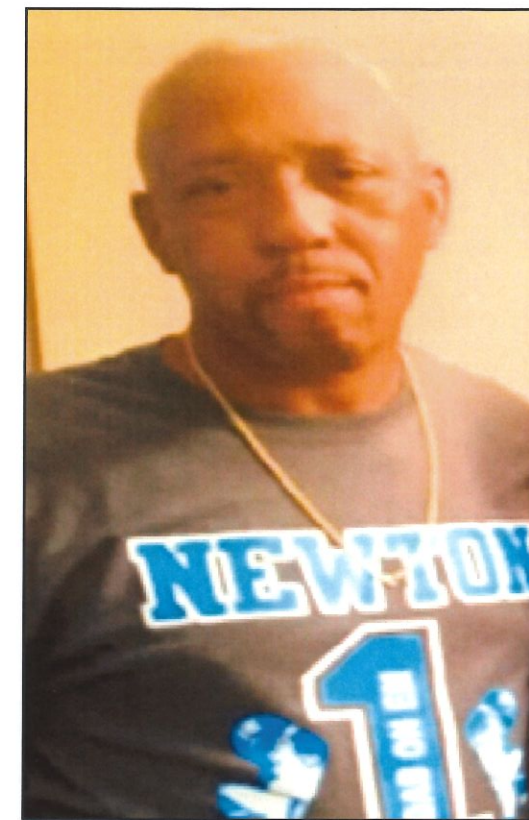
Daddy....
