

CROSSING THE BAR

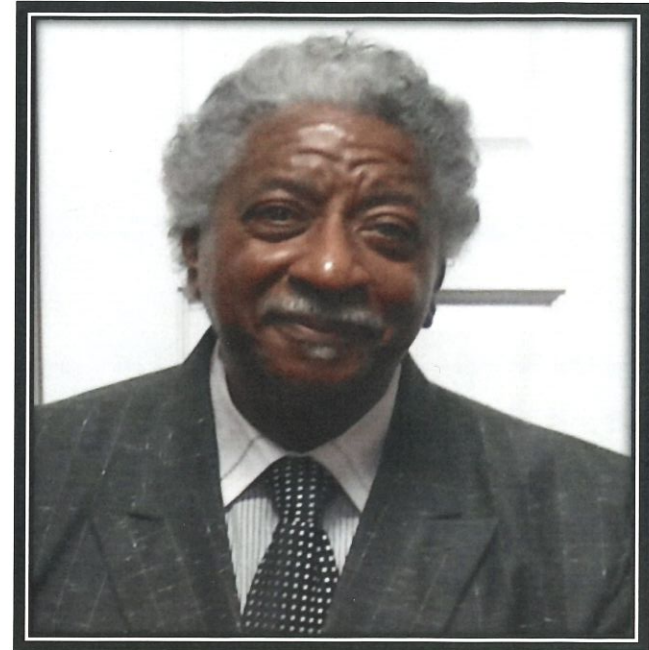
*SUNSET and evening star,
