





Memory and Rosa Lewis Purdy was born on July 5, 1928 in Bladen County North Carolina and was called to be with the Lord on January 10, 2021.

At an early age she dedicated her life to Christ. She was an active member of First Baptist Church of Bladenboro where began as a pianist for Sunday School. She continued faithful service as an accomplished musician and organist for youth, AC Jones Chorale, senior and male choirs for 75 years. She never accepted compensation during her musical service to the church. For 46 of the 75 years, she was the musician for two churches, First Baptist Missionary Baptist Church and Bryant Swamp Missionary Baptist Church. She served many years in Bladen County Union #2 - president, missionary department, union circle, Lumber River Baptist Association and scholarship committees. At First Baptist she was also on: Program and Budget, Nominating, Necrology and volunteered for the Loving Hands Day Care. Within the community she was the one of the founding organizers and Chairperson (until late 2020) of Brooklyn Memorial Garden Foundation, Spaulding-Monroe Alumni Association and Bladen County Retired School Personnel.

She received numerous awards, certificates and recognition for services rendered in the music ministry, education, church and community. In January 2015, she received the Order of the Long Leaf Pine.

Juanita graduated from Booker T. Washington High School in

Clarkton, NC. She received her bachelor's degree in English from Shaw University in Raleigh, NC. She taught English and French in Bladen County NC from 1949 to 1991 at Spaulding Monroe High School (1949-1967) and Bladenboro High School (1968-1991).
