So join us all in Heaven, I'll tell you what to do.

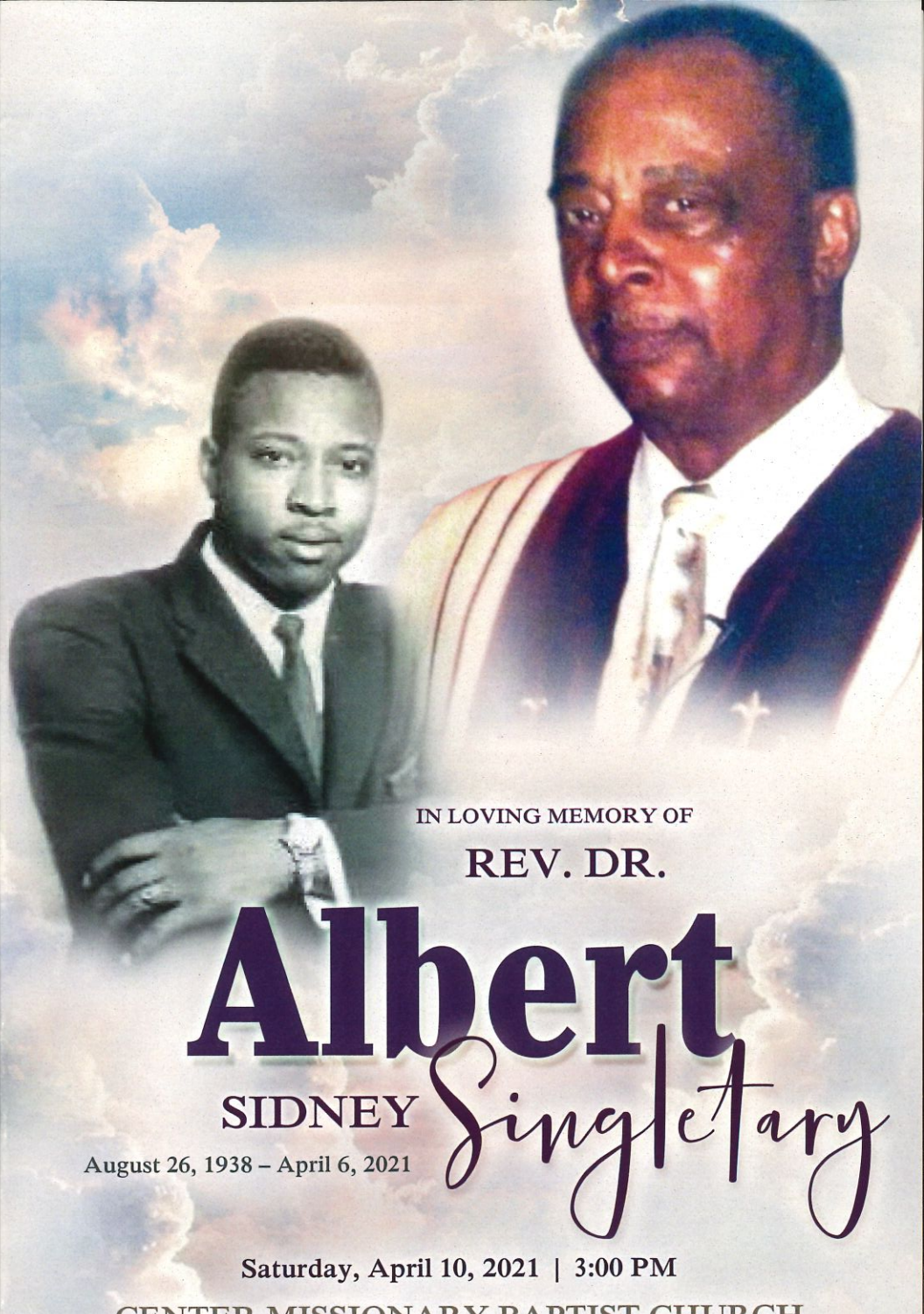
Accept Jesus as your savior, He will wash your sins away.

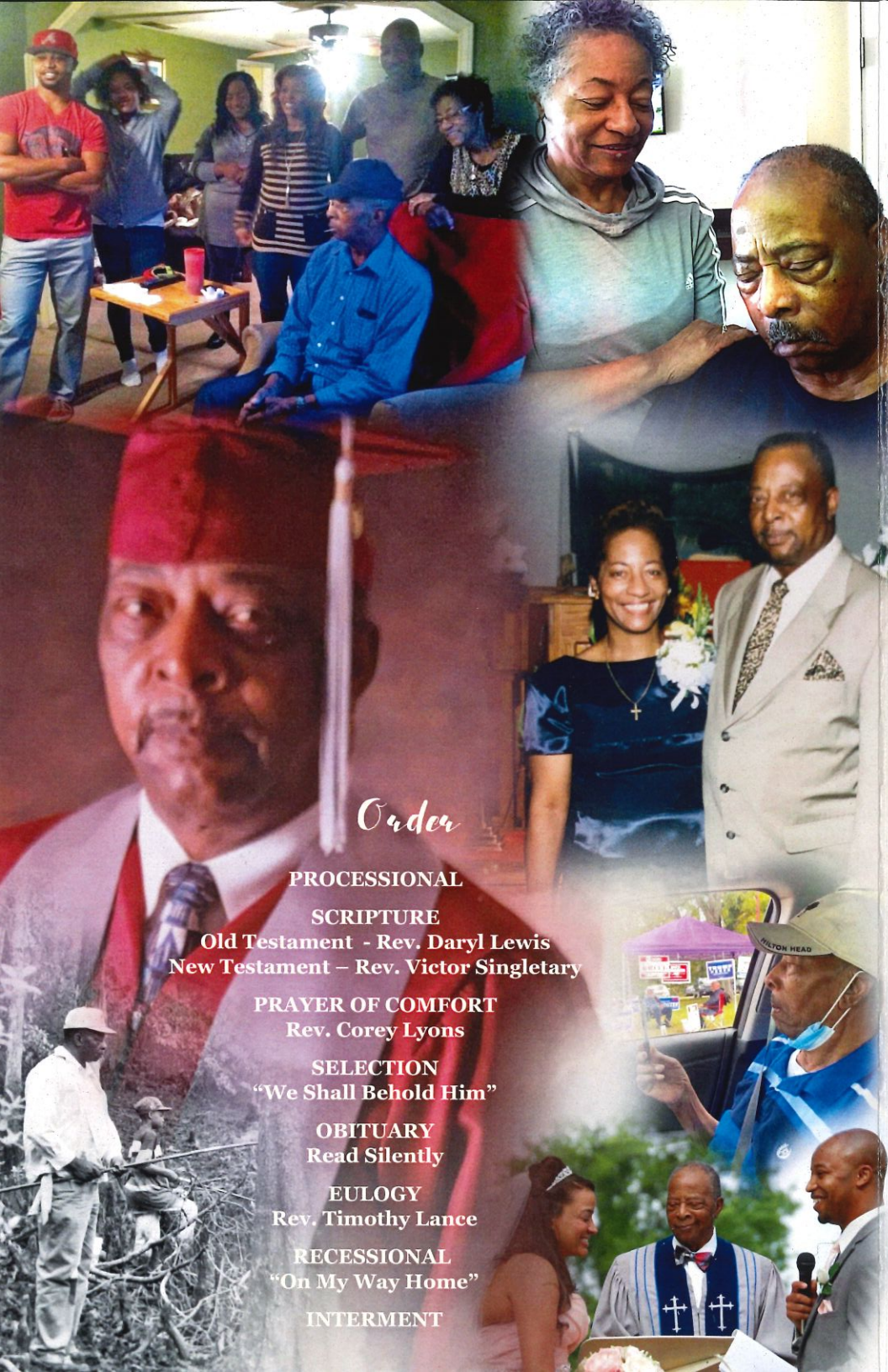

Rev. Dr. Albert Sidney Singletary, 82, departed this life on Tuesday, April 6, 2021 at his home in Bladenboro, North Carolina.

Reverend Singletary was the husband of 62 years to Norma Rosa Lee Johnson Singletary and former Pastor of Center Missionary Baptist Church. He is survived by four children: Reginald Singletary (Paula) of Concord, NC; Chandler Dion Singletary (Katonya) of Kannapolis, NC; Melissa Singletary of Charlotte, NC; and Sonya Sellars (Rodney) of Charlotte, NC. He was further survived by six siblings: Arlene Overton of Charlotte, NC; Marilyn Smith (Edward) of Charlotte, NC; Leroy Singletary (Shirley) of Bladenboro, NC; Donald Singletary (Agnes) of Lumberton, NC; Selma Brooks of Bladenboro, NC; and Sheriel McDonald (Calhoun) of Whiteville, NC. He was preceded in death by his parents Albert Ezra Singletary (Ethel) and Lucille Lennon (Maceo); one sister Pearline Scott; his brothers Henry Lanace Singletary, Tony Durant Singletary, and Ovanual Singletary.

Rev. Singletary was born to Ezra and Lucille Powell Singletary on August 26, 1938 in Bladen County, North Carolina. He graduated from Spaulding Monroe High School in 1956 and moved to Arlington, Virginia, where he enlisted in The U.S. Army Reserves. He married his high school sweetheart, Norma Johnson, on January 30, 1959. They resided in Washington, DC where he was employed by Capital Transit before moving back to Bladenboro. Upon returning to North Carolina, he served as a Bladen County Deputy Sheriff for many years and was affectionately known as "Chief" to many in the community. He was the co-owner of A & N Family Care, where he and Norma provided long-term care to elderly people for 31 years. He accepted the call into the ministry and served as Pastor of Center Missionary Baptist Church for 22 years. After a long illness, Reverend Singletary passed away surrounded by his family leaving a host of friends, family, and his beloved congregation.
