#### Obituary



Ethel Jorinda Johnson, daughter of the late Pauline Powell Johnson Hood and Brodus Johnson, was born October 30, 1930 in the small town of Gasden, South Carolina. On Thursday, May 20, 2021, she peacefully transitioned this world at her home.

After graduating from high school, Ethel continued her education at North Carolina A & T State University where she majored in English and French. There she joined Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated and was a member of the Marching Band. Ethel went on to receive her Master's Degree at Boston University.

Ethel began her teaching career at Westside High School, Chadbourn, North Carolina. The system desegregated in 1969 and she moved to West Columbus High School, Cerro Gordo, North Carolina. Ethel made an enormous impact on her students. She showed genuine concern and always encouraged them to be the best they could be. She would go out of her way to make sure they had the tools and knowledge to excel.

Ethel was a strong woman of God so when moving to Chadbourn, she joined Saint John Missionary Baptist Church, where she faithfully served until she relocated to Whiteville, North Carolina and joined Friendship Missionary Baptist Church. At Friendship, Ethel served as president of the Missionary Circle for many years. After her tenure as president, she remained active, most notably as the coordinator for the Liberty Commons Nursing Home ministry. She taught the Adult Sunday School class until her health no longer allowed.

Ethel's love for God's word inspired her to teach the Sunday School lesson on WENC and WVOE Radio Stations. She will be remembered for reminding us, "If you work the Word, the Word works."

A woman of excellence, Ethel wore many hats and belonged to many organizations. She was honored by The Tri-County Campaign UNCF for being an outstanding educator. She was a member of Alpha Mu Honor Society, president of the YWCA Columbus County, NAACP, Westside Alumni Association, Bladen-Columbus Chapter NC A & T Alumni Association, and Columbus County NCAE.


# In Loving Memory of Our Beautiful Mother

Each time we see your picture You seem to smile and say, "Don't cry, I'm in God's hands, We'll meet again someday!"


