OBITUARY

Reverend Dr. Grace Miller was born Gracie V. Peterson in Bladen County, North Carolina on July 22, 1931, to the late Johnnie Peterson and Mady McKoy- Peterson. She shared a home with 8 siblings, including Marvin Peterson, Roger Peterson, Enner Freeman, Rosa Lee Williams, Pauline McCants, and Oneal Peterson. Reverend Dr. Grace Miller was immersed in faith early on and attended Jerusalem Missionary Baptist Church in Council North Carolina, where she was saved at the young age of 12. Reverend Dr. Grace Miller also attended Booker T. Washington High School in Clarkton North Carolina and graduated in 1949.

Soon after graduation, Reverend Dr. Grace Miller would move to Wilmington, North Carolina and it was there where she would fall in love and meet her future husband, James Miller. The couple would go on to have 3 children, Suzanne Miller, James Miller, and Beverly Miller. The family would later relocate to Brooklyn, New York.

While in Brooklyn, Reverend Dr. Grace Miller began working at Kings County Hospital as a nurse's aide, primarily in the pediatric unit. It was there she became inspired to become a registered nurse and began her educational journey to fulfill that dream. Grace would attend the Borough of Manhattan Community College in New York City, where she received her Associate in Applied Science in January 1974, followed by receipt of her New York State-issued nursing license in April 1974. Reverend Dr. Grace Miller would also continue on to receive her Bachelor of Science from the New York Institute College of Technology. She worked at Kings County Hospital as a registered nurse for many years and gained the title of assistant nursing director at Kingsboro Psychiatric Center in Brooklyn, New York prior to retirement.
















Reverend Dr. Grace Miller would later move to Jamaica Queens, New York where she would become a longtime resident of the Rochdale Village Co-Op Community for over 40 years until her passing. After retirement, Reverend Dr. Grace Miller remained embraced in her faith and was a member of Calvary Baptist Church in Jamaica, Queens, New York. While at Calvary, she found her 2nd calling in the church and began pursuing her dreams of becoming a reverend. She received her Certificate of Ordination in 1996. Reverend Dr. Grace Miller attended New Brunswick Theological Seminary in New Jersey and received her Master of Divinity, followed by her Doctor of Divinity. She preached with the ministry for almost 30 years and was a founding member of New Jerusalem Baptist Church, now New Jerusalem Worship Center in Jamaica, Queens New York.

Reverend Dr. Grace Miller had a larger-than-life presence. She was outspoken, spunky, protective, and funny. She loved her family, she loved to dress with style, she loved angels and she loved red cardinal birds as they reminded her of her late mother. Reverend Dr. Grace Miller also loved crocheting, laughing, cooking, and baking (especially sweet potato pies) for those she loved. Reverend Dr. Grace Miller LOVED The Lord and she shared that love not only with her family but with the world around her. Her physical presence will be FOREVER missed!
