

He studied education and became a member of Kappa Alpha Psi, Fraternity. Upon graduation he quickly gained employment in Pasquotank County. The next year applied to and accepted a teaching position in Columbus County.

During his third year of teaching, he attended a workshop that would change his life forever. He met the love of his life, a young charismatic talkative 1st year 1st day teacher Earnestine "Tiney" Ford. As the saying goes opposites attract. For these two Franklin & Tiney it was love at first sight. This quiet, young, handsome, good smelling well dressed gentleman was smitten with the young talkative, flirty, well dressed Tiney Ford. Their romance was a sweet love story in which he proposed on Christmas day the December before their July 26 wedding. The wedding was a high-class affair with the gentleman Franklin dressed in tuxedo tails and a beautiful white boutonniere. He kept their wedding album in a special place. He cherished his life with his wife Tiney. He could not live without her and Tiney was with him as he transitioned, holding his hand until his body was cold. Their love lives on and will never die as their marriage produced two daughters Frankye and Camille (Millie). Franklin was the original girl dad as he doted on his girls and was a complete pushover. His daddy mode was loving, sweet, proud, encouraging, protective, responsible, funny, understanding, present, smart, handsome and honestly too many accolades to name. He has a son and although he was not raised in Cerro Gordo, they shared a bond through sports. Franklin attended all Dedric's sports games throughout high school. He is proud of his son.

Franklin has five grandchildren. His oldest grandchild is Raven she lives in the house. They are best buds. They share the same humor, love of reading, and basic personality. Jordan is his sweet baby and nurse. There wasn't anything that Papa asked Jordan that she was not happy to do.

He is the best Papa to Raven and Jordan. He shares a love of sports with his grandchildren who are student athletes, Cera (Volleyball), Dedric II (Basketball), Drake (Basketball), Jordan (Cheer). His legacy will live on through them.

In addition to being a family man, Franklin was also a devout Christian man who lived by the values he learned from his Bible studies. Mount Hebron A.M.E. Zion Church was his church home throughout his entire life where he served many roles. He served as Pastor's Steward, sang on the male choir, was a Trustee Board member & Sunday School teacher to name a few. He was punctual and prepared for church. On most Sundays he drove 22 miles to church. Some Sundays he remained in Cerro Gordo and went to church at Mount Tabor Baptist Church. On the days prior to church, he could be observed reading his lessons and Bible commentary. He was as serious student regarding the Bible, and he believed in the Lord. He relied upon his church teachings to give back to his community. He was role model and father figure to several people in the surrounding areas. He refereed basketball and softball recreational games. He was a member of the bowling league where he won scoring awards. He loaned money, gave away good clothes and taught more than one boy how to be a man.

Teaching was his calling. As a black man he knew his presence was necessary. He considered it an honor to impart wisdom onto the minds of the youth. He held high standards, he was a subject matter expert and he expected you to learn with deliberateness and pride. "Neat and Legible" was his motto. He loved his students, and the feeling was mutual. As a testament to this truth students from his first class to his last continued to call him or drop by the home he shared with his family until his transition. He also has several good teacher friends from his time teaching.

To know Franklin was to love him. We have all experienced a great lost. Specifically, he leaves to mourn his passing: wife, Earnestine "Tiney", children Frankye (Cleo), Trina (Sarita), and Dedrick, (Cherice), siblings Robert, Betty (Clarence), Blondell, Brenda, and Harold (Sharon), grandchildren Raven, Cera, Dedrick II, Drake and Jordan along with a host of nieces and nephews.

He was a gentleman, very professional, humble unique individual with a special personality who protected his family. He will be truly missed by his loving wife and children. He will live on in the hearts and minds of countless family members, community members, former students, coworkers and friends.
