Rev. Retha Mae ("Reather") Haynes passed from this life on March 8th, 2022 after living eightyone years blessing the lives of countless people who came to know her as family and friend.

Retha was always ready with a prayer and prepared to witness to anyone, be they inmates, disabled veterans, friends, or family. She was a rock of faith and example of God's love every day she lived. All were a beloved friend to Retha Mae Haynes.

She demonstrated this divine love to her five children and impressed upon them the importance of living good lives spent in service. Her first son, Nathaniel, died one day after birth, but she went on to have four more children-- William, Denise, Christopher, and Michelle. She raised them in the Edenwald neighborhood of the Bronx and encouraged them to find joy in the rewards of hard work and unfailing faith. She also showed them not just how to live good lives, but how to enjoy them; after retirement, Retha found herself quite fond of cruises and relaxing vacations spent in the company of family.

Retha's family feels a profound loss at her death, but are strengthened by the testimony she left behind: that we are saved by the grace of Jesus and that because of His grace, she is now reunited with her dear parents, younger brother, baby sister, and son Nathaniel who preceded her in death. She has been called home and we look forward to the day we see her again.
