Obituary

Hattie Lee Richardson Frazier was born October 22, 1960 in Bunnell, Florida. She was the daughter of the late Ruby Inez Gilyard Ward and Ben Thomas of Homerville, Georgia. Hattie was preceded in death by her late husband; George Frazier (Willard, NC), both parents, and two brothers; Warnell “Teddy” Williams (Bunnell, FL) and Willie (Betty) Thomas (Darien, GA).

Hattie spent a small part of her early childhood living in Eau Gallie, Florida with her family.
