She has been a mother to so many in the community. She was the first female driver's education teacher in Sampson County Schools. She was published in the Arithmetic Teacher magazine in 1985.

She was a long time member of the Democratic Women's Association and volunteered at the polls. She contributed and supported numerous other programs as well giving of her time, resources, and heart.

that I must bid you this farewell.

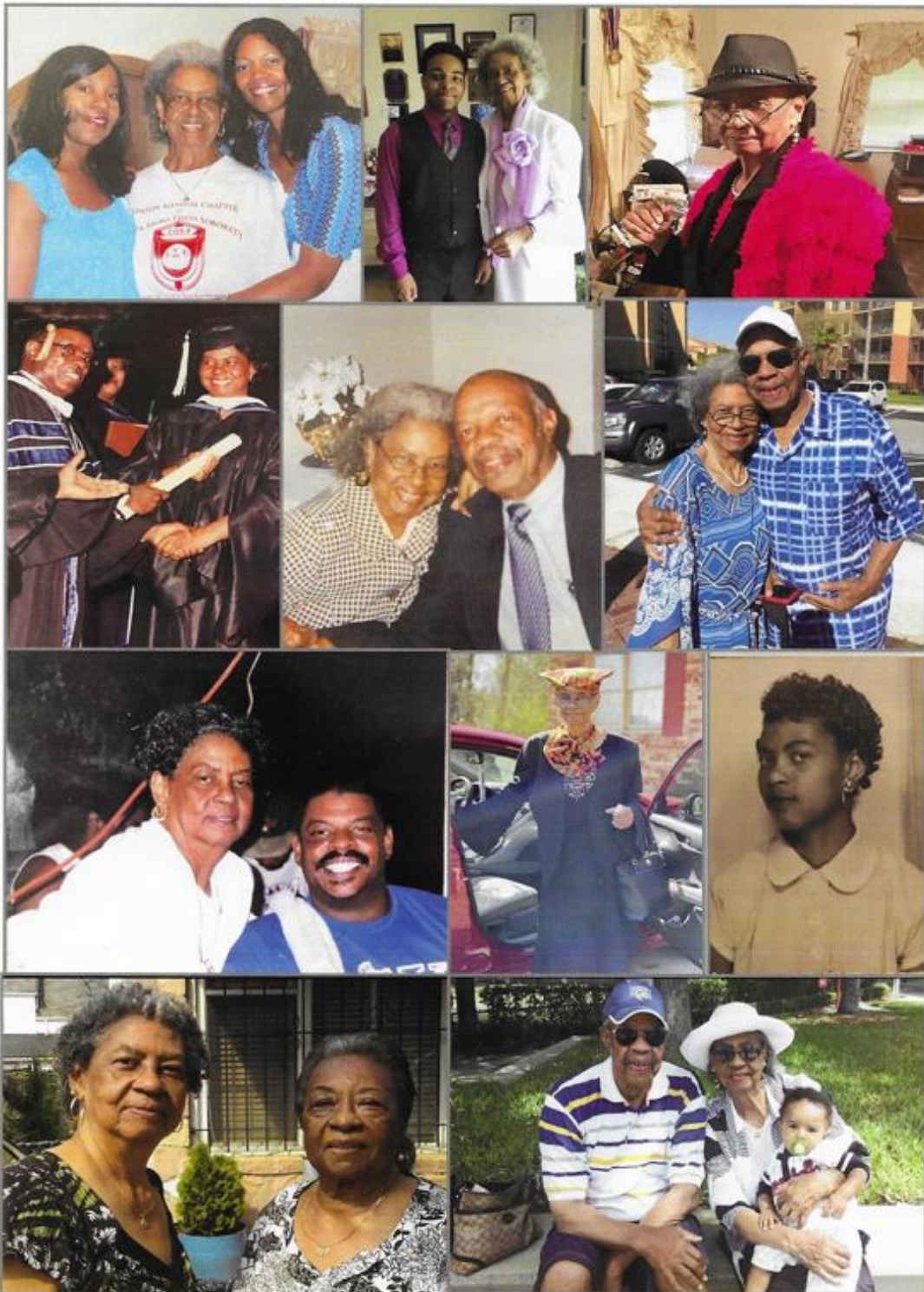
I'll remember all you've taught me
