Remembering Marinda....

Marinda Louise Thrower Davis was born in Wise, North Carolina, on May 10, 1943, to the late Gilford and Nora Davis Thrower. She peacefully departed this life on Monday, September 6, 2021, while at home.

"Rindy," as she was known to family and close friends, graduated from North Warren High School in June 1960 and later accepted a position in the school's office. She frequently attended her class reunions and assisted in helping to establish a DC/MD chapter of the Alumni Association.
