Life's Reflections



Mr. Aubrey Pulliam was born May 25, 1943, in Okolona, Mississippi. He was preceded in death by his parents and one sister.

Aubrey confessed his faith in Christ at an early age. He was educated in the Chickasaw County, Mississippi, School District. He relocated to St. Louis, Missouri in 1959, at the age of 16 and worked as a delivery boy at the local Shoppers' Market located on Maple and Goodfellow. He graduated from Soldan High School in 1961, and went on to attend Washington University.

In his early 20s, Aubrey was the first African-American to work on the first floor of Famous-Barr in downtown St. Louis. Having an eye for fashion, in 1969, he was offered an opportunity to relocate to New York City, where he spent his career working at Bloomingdale's for 41 years until his retirement.

Aubrey departed this life on Wednesday, June 19, 2019, at the age of 76.
