#### John Harvey Webb

John Harvey Webb, 91, of Greensboro died August 25, 2020 at Athens Piedmont Hospital. A native of Greene County, he was born March 30, 1929 to John William and Norene Jennings Webb of Penfield. He grew up on the family farm and joined the U.S. Army at 17 serving 4 years in Korea and Japan.

Harvey started Webb Construction Company in the late 1950's building and remodeling many houses in the area. In 1961, he began Webb Brothers Building Supply to have a local source of his building materials. He was a keen business man and was successful in all his ventures with remodeling projects continuing until the time of his death. He served on the board of directors of Central and Southern Bank for many years where he enjoyed inspecting construction projects throughout the lake area.
