Mary Durham Caldwell died peacefully on February 21, 2021 one day before her 93rd birthday. Born in Greensboro to Mattie Leona Bethea and Dr. Columbus Joseph “Doc” Durham, she lived nearly all her life in Greene County. Known for her love and steadfast support of her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren, “Miss Mary” attended both Georgia State College for Women in Milledgeville and the University of Georgia. She married Robert Russell Caldwell on March 6, 1949 and raised two generations in her home. “Memom” was an avid fan of UGA football, loved playing bridge and watching old westerns.
