he matriarch of the family, Lula Belle Groves was surrounded by her legacy when she peacefully transitioned to heaven on December 6, 2019. Lula Groves lived a full life to the age of 91 and resided in South Bend, Indiana for over 60 years. Lula was born to the union of Alford and Ada (Pitts) Jones on April 13, 1928 in Greensboro, Alabama.
