

Obitnary

DEACON WILLIE "PAW PAW" WILLIAMS was born on August 20, 1919, in Waterproof, Louisiana and transitioned from labor to glory on July 2, 2021, at his residence, at the great age of 101.

Willie moved along with his family to South Bend, Indiana in 1929. Paw Paw was drafted in World War II in 1940 and was stationed in Papua, New Guinea. He was honorably discharged in 1945 after serving five years and gaining the rank of Staff Sargent. Papa was always known as a hard worker. His work history included working for Clark, Studebaker, and A.M. General, where he worked for 40 years from 1945 to retirement in 1985. He then drove the bus for Head Start from 1985-2003. After fully retiring, Paw Paw would work on lawn equipment. Paw Paw stayed busy working and folks kept Paw Paw busy.

Our Paw Paw was a FAITHFUL member of Pentecostal Cathedral COGIC, where he served as an usher, deacon, trustee board member, and president of the V.I.P. department, under the leadership of Bishop Donald Alford. He would regularly and faithfully attend bible study on Tuesday nights, where his job would be filling the pops and ice in the cooler, which he took very, very seriously. He would go to the church at 9 p.m. Monday through Saturday, when he would be trustee of the week, and turn off the alarm up until he turned 90. Deacon Williams received many awards in his lifetime and held an award in his name at Pentecostal, the "Willie Williams Lifetime Award." Paw Paw was honored in the senior coalition hosted by New Salem MBC. For his 100th birthday, he was featured on WNDU news by the American Legion Riders. You could regularly see Willie at Krogers talking to everyone in the store and the employees, or at the Ardmore hardware store.

Papa SPOILED Granny; he loved, loved, loved her. Paw Paw showed us what being a great husband was and provided for his entire family. Any of us could call on our Paw Paw, and he would be there at the drop of a pin. He would come do work on different family members houses or cars if needed; he was the jack of all trades. Papa loved baseball, with the LA Dodgers being his favorite team.

Along with his wife, Catherine, survivors left to cherish Paw Paw memories include: two sons, Tarrance Prierson of CA and Willie Williams of KY; five daughters for whom he accepted the role of father, Vanessa Hill, Pamela (Earl) Townsend, and Sheila (Tommy) Stokes, all of South Bend, Kathy Kirkendoll of Austin, TX, and Tonya (Carl) Wiggins of Union, NJ; sisters-in-law, Dorothy Hill of GA and Pearline Hamilton of South Bend; 16 grandchildren; 17 great-grandchildren; 5 great-great-grandchildren; one godson, Patric Owens; two goddaughters, Quila Osborn and Jacqueline Johnson; a special son, Elder Maurice Hackney; honorary children, Viola and Ernest McClenty, Linda "Boochie" Sanders, Elois "Peaches" White, Betty (Andre) Bridges, and Kent Winters; and a host of nieces and nephews.
