DeCarlos Roosevelt Scott was born September 9, 1968 in South Bend, Indiana to Veronica (Pigee) Collins and Lavance Charles Williams. He graduated from Arlington High School in Indianapolis and then enlisted in the United States Navy where he proudly served his country with honors for 7 years.

DeCarlos was a man of many talents and was not afraid to let them shine. From being a master on the basketball court to showing off his vocals in the studio. DeCarlos formed a singing group with his brother, Priest, and co-wrote the most played song on the local artist radio show. This song went 14 weeks in a role at No. 1. and then turned around and co-produced another song with his other brother, Darmon Bond which became the summer's local jam for everyone.

DeCarlos R. Scott of 2021 Miami Street died Wednesday in his home of natural causes.
