The Life Reflections of HOMER BROWN, JR.

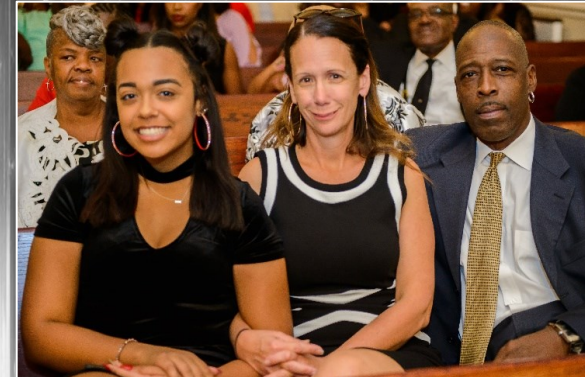
