

### Life Reflections of Deacon E. R. Murrell, Sr.

Edward Ray Murrell Sr. was born on February 23, 1934 to his parents, Monroe & Lucy Murrell. He received his formal education from Fouke Public School in the Fouke Community of Hawkins, Texas.

Edward Murrell Sr. accepted Christ at an early age at New Zion Baptist Church of Hawkins under the pastorate of Rev. J. J. Johnson. After moving to Dallas, he joined with the Forest Avenue Baptist Church under the leadership of Rev. E.A. Greer. In 1970, he united with the Greater New Hope Baptist Church where he was guided under the leadership of Rev. J. G. Mackey where he became a Sunday School teacher, and later was ordained as a deacon. He served as a leader of the Bus Ministry, and Young Men's Ministry where he organized baseball and basketball teams. He was very much involved with the youth not only in the church, but also throughout the community - where he was a great mentor.

Deacon Edward Murrell Sr. also served on the local, state, and national conventions for the Brotherhood Union as president on the state level and was the 3rd vice-president on the national level. He would ALWAYS wear his cowboy boots at the convention – and the brothers could be heard saying, "There goes that fellow from Texas!" Serving with the Brotherhood was a great joy for Deacon Murrell. So much so, he was awarded Brotherhood Man of the Year twice, in 1996 and again in 2017.

Edward Murrell Sr. enjoyed working with his hands. He put this to work while employed with Texas Meat Packing and Super Affiliated Foods – where he was a supervisor. He was the co-founder of J & S Custom Chemical. He then went on to own E & F Handywork. While he was a hard worker, he also enjoyed playing dominoes and being a jokester.


In the year of 1969, he married the love of his life, Frances on December 27 and they shared a bond like no other until his passing.
