Profile Of Life



On November 13, 1942, Bennie L. Seymore (Pop) was born to Quincy and Daisy Seymore in Bamberg, SC. He was the fourth of nine children. He was preceded in death by his father, mother, and three siblings: Earthel, Yourner Mae, and Willard Seymore. He was baptized at First Mt. Sinai, and later moved his membership to First Bryan Baptist Church.

He was an integral part of the Curry Town Reunion, instrumental in advocacy and youth development at Alfred Ely Beach High School. Bennie found joy in providing holiday celebrations for the youth in his family. He had a stint of appearances as “Santa Claus” during First Bryan Baptist Church’s Christmas celebrations.

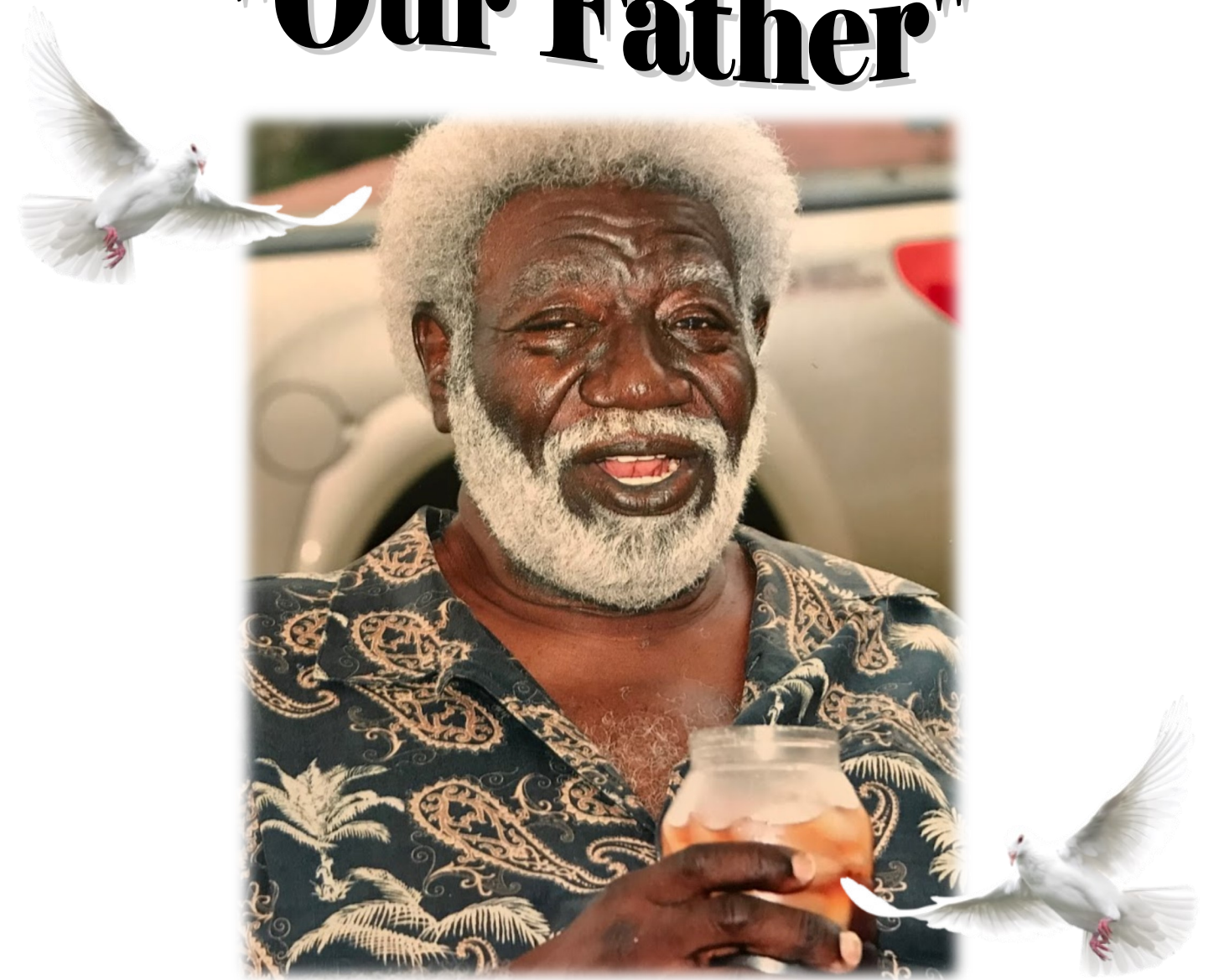
Bennie was drafted in the U.S. Army in 1967 where he served two years in the Vietnam Conflict as an Army Specialist. Immediately following his honorable discharge from the Army, Bennie was a staunch participant in the Civil Right’s Movement here in Savannah, GA. He was active in the local NAACP movement in Savannah.

Returning to Savannah after the war, he began his career with Union Camp (International Paper) where in 2004 he retired with 39 years of service as a pulp mill engineer. During his employment with Union Camp, Bennie served as the United Way of Coastal Empire representative; a role which he loved.

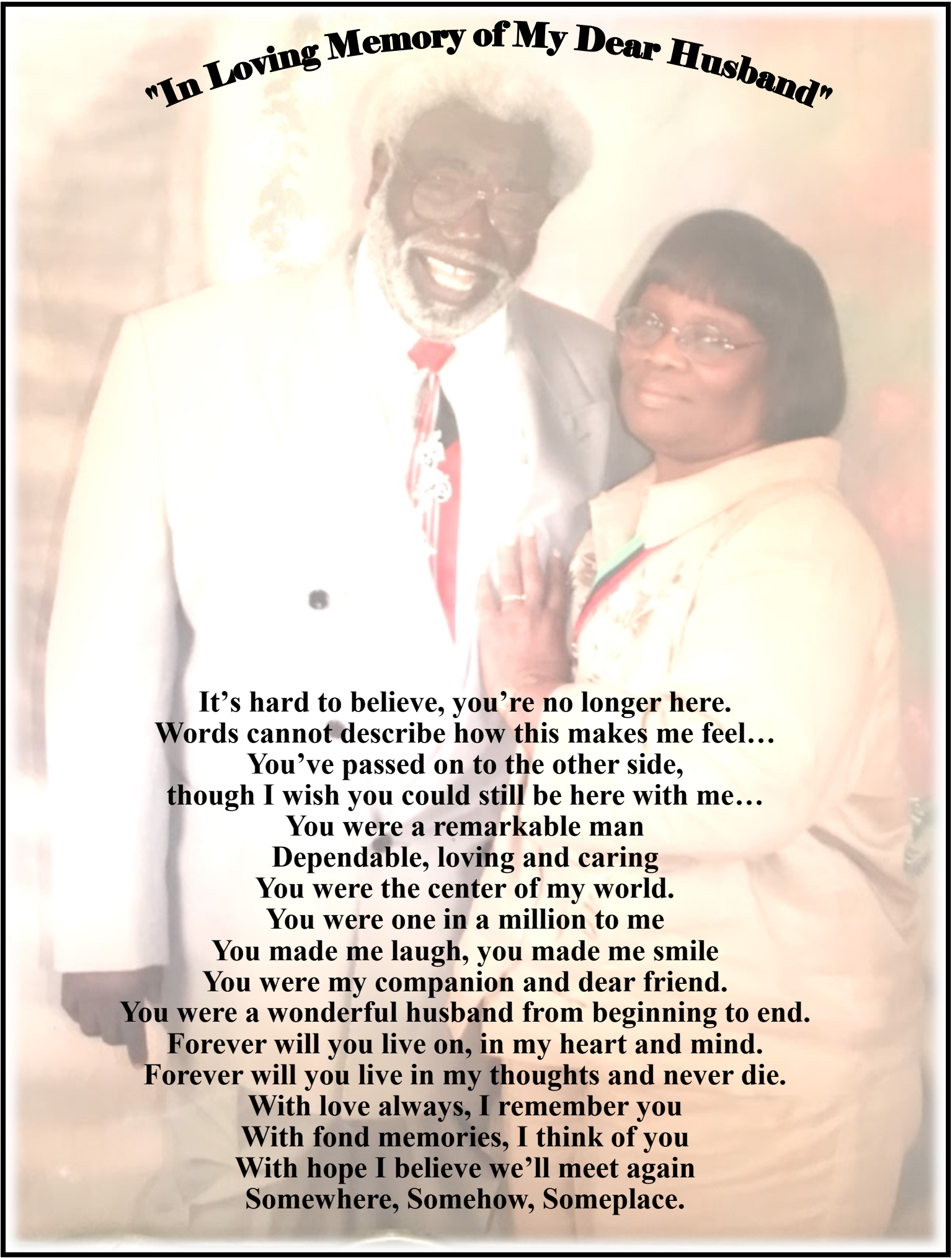
