

Brother Howard Brown, affectionately known as Rahim Muhammad, husband of Deborah Muhammad Brown, was born on December 23, 1950, and returned to Allah on January 16, 2022. He was 71 years old. May Allah accept his good deeds and enter him into Janat ul Firdous. He was an only child of his mother, Alice Grace Edwards and father, Howard Brown Sr. of Cincinnati, Ohio. He loved his parents dearly, especially his mother, with whom he shared a close bond. Those who knew him will remember Rahim as a loving father, grandfather and friend.

As a child, Howard was born and raised in Cincinnati, OH. During the tail end of The Great Migration, he and his mother relocated to Newark, NJ where she re-married and obtained employment with General Motors. During this time, Howard would accept Islam early into his life at the age of 20 years old, after being introduced to it by his favorite uncle, Harry (Omar) Robinson. He would later take the Muslim name of Rahim ("Merciful", "Compassionate"). It is in New Jersey where Howard attended Weequahic High School. Although they attended high school at the same time, Howard and Deborah did not know one another. Yet, in 1972 by chance encounter at a Nation of Islam bakery, Howard and Deborah would begin their courtship. They would wed on August 2, 1975. From this union, Howard and Deborah would have two children, Omar Rahim Brown and Nadirah Brown-Griffin.

Howard was an employee for General Motors' Linden, NJ plant for over 15 years. Later, he would pursue an entrepreneurial endeavor with his close friend Abdul, in A&R jewelry. Sometime after this, he would move back to Cincinnati where he worked for the Kroger Corporation and later Formica Corporation, the latter of which he retired.

Those that knew Howard will remember him for his boisterous laughter, his longstanding love of Cadillacs and his affinity for the sharpest of clothes and alligator shoes. He also had a love for timeless music. Some of his favorite acts were The Isley Brothers, Frankie Beverly & Maze, Kool & The Gang and Paul Hardcastle.

JANAZAH PRAYER

The deceased Muslim is placed horizontally in front of the Imam who stands, according to the Sunnah, at the shoulder of the deceased. The believers stand behind the Imam. There is no Ruku (bowing) or Sujuud (prostration) in the prayer. The prayer is conducted in an upright standing position, Qiyam and contains four takbirs.

FIRST TAKBIR: The Imam says "Allahu Akbar" (God is Greatest), raising his hands to his ears and placing them between the chest and the navel. The followers do the same.

The Imam recites Surah Al Fatiha.

"In The Name of Allah, The Most Gracious, The Most Merciful .. All Praise is due to Allah, Lord of the worlds. The Most Gracious, The Most Merciful, Sovereign of the Day of Recompense. It is You we worship and You we ask for help. Guide us to the straight path - The path of those upon whom You have bestowed favor, not of those who have evoked Your anger or of those who are astray. Ameen"

SECOND TAKBIR:

The Imam says "Allahu Akbar" without raising his hands. The followers repeat. They then invoke Allah's blessings upon the Prophet Muhammad (SAW) by reciting Salatu 'Alan Nabiyy. "O Allah, shower Your Mercy upon Muhammad and the followers of Muhammad, as You showered Your Mercy upon Ibrahim and the followers of Ibrahim. Behold You are Praiseworthy. Glorious, Oh Allah, shower Your Blessings upon Muhammad and the followers of Muhammad as You showered Your Blessings upon Ibrahim and the followers of Ibrahim. Behold, You are Praiseworthy, Glorious."

THIRD TAKBIR:

After the third takbir, the Imam and believers pray for the deceased by saying the following:

"Oh Allah, forgive those of us that are alive and those of us that are dead, those of us that are present and those of us who are absent; our minors and our elders; Oh Allah, whomsoever of us you keep alive, let him live as a follower of Islam and whomsoever of us you cause to die, let him die as a believer.

FOURTH TAKBIR:

The Imam says "Allahu Akbar and the believers repeat. They then proceed with: "Oh Allah, do no deny the reward which is due him, do not expose us to temptation after his death. Forgive us and him.

The Imam concludes the prayer with:

"As Salaamu 'Aiaikum wa Rahmatullahi"* and the believers repeat.

*Peace and Mercy of Allah be upon you.

BURIAL

The deceased is then taken to the burial ground where, according to the Sunnah (tradition of the Prophet (SAW), he is placed facing the Qiblah (direction of prayer). While the body is being lowered into the grave, one may utter:

"In the Name of Allah, (we bury) according to the Sunnah of the Messenger of Allah. Witnesses may help fill the grave with dirt with two hands at least three times. Out of It we created you, And into it we deposit you. And from it we shall take you out once again."
