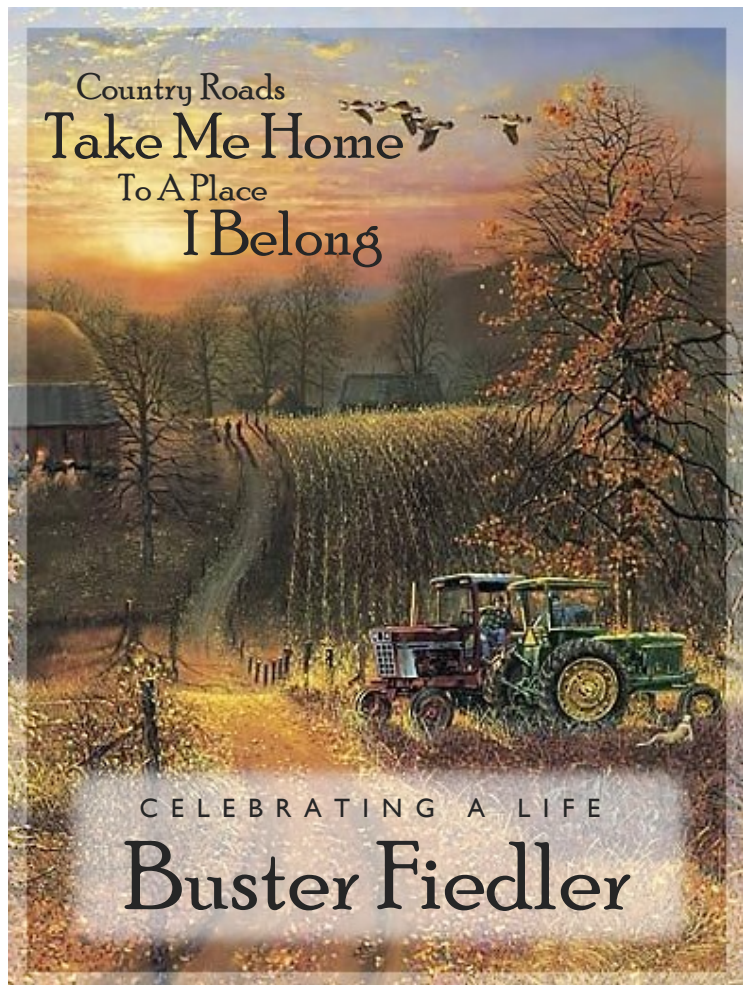




Silent Tear
