Clara Stella (Mischke) Bauck was born on October 22, 1922 in Perham, Minnesota. Her parents were the late Emil and Sophia (Knickrehm) Mischke. She was baptized on November 5, 1922 at St. John's Lutheran Church in Corliss and her sponsors were: August Mischke, Hulda Mischke and Stella Lange. Clara attended Country School District #225, in Corliss Township, rural Perham, Minnesota. In the late 1940's Clara resided in Long Beach, California, where she was employed at a shoe store and dry cleaners.

On September 20, 1949 Clara was united in marriage to Norbert Christopher Bauck at Clara's homeplace in Corliss Township. Their marriage was blessed with six children. Clara and Norbert resided and farmed in Pine Lake Township until 1982, when they moved into New York Mills. Norbert passed away in 2002.
