On June 10, 1963 LeRoy was united in marriage to Joyce Koplin at St. Henry's Catholic Church in Perham, Minnesota. Their marriage was blessed with 3 children: Mitch, Shelly and Kim. Together, they made their home in Perham. LeRoy was employed with Hammer Construction, Trites Turkey, and Worked as a Lineman for Lake Region Electrical from 1974 until retiring in 2001. Joyce passed away on August 1, 2002.
