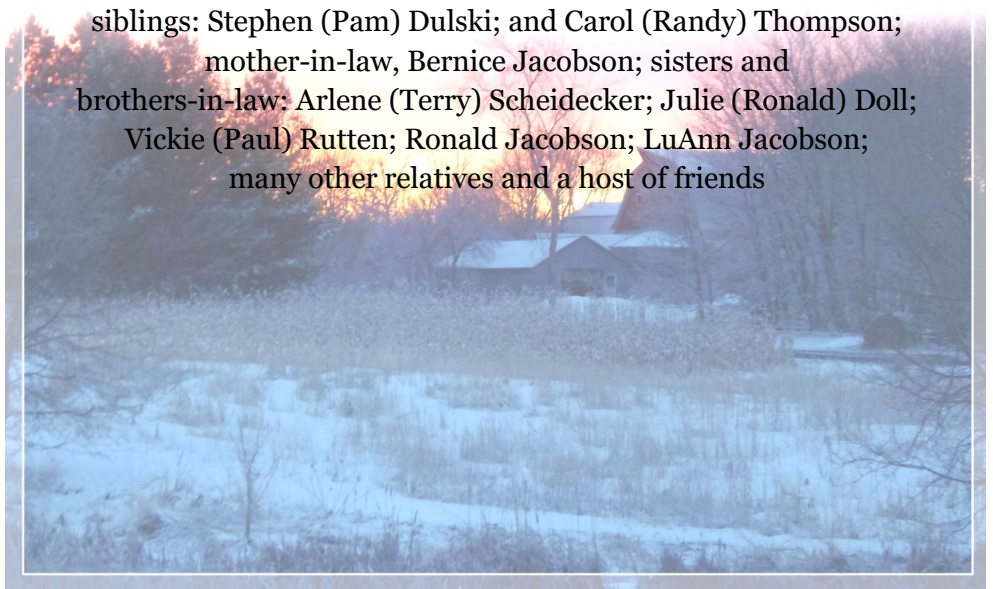

Her kitchen skills were second to none; she loved finding new recipes to try. Laura also enjoyed Black Friday shopping with her sister Carol, her nieces, and her daughters - she wouldn't buy much but looked forward to getting up early after searching all the ads and our 11:00 lunch date where we would talk about all of our finds. Red's love and dedication to Laura allowed her to stay at home for care which led to meaningful connections with her caregivers. She enjoyed their visits and going on outings with Jody and Dave. Laura endured many difficult years of a rare, debilitating disease that stripped her of so many day-to-day abilities, and yet her perseverance was nothing less than admirable. She was the strongest, hardworking, Christian wife and mother. Even when it was hard for her to verbalize, Laura's smile, contagious laugh and sense of humor continued to be her light. She battled to beat the disease and if it were up to her, she would still be fighting for Red and her family.

On November 10, 2021, Laura passed away peacefully at her home at 67 years of age next to the love of her life. She will be dearly missed by her family and friends.
