Michael loved to travel in his RV with his family and always loved a good sports car. His favorite vacation destination was Montego Bay, Jamaica.

Michael was diagnosed with Lung Cancer in December 2019. He battled with treatments of Radiation & Chemotherapy and seemed to be leaning toward recovery. On December 11, 2020, just before daybreak his immune system just couldn't take anymore and he went home to be with the Lord. Vickie was such a loving wife who fulfilled all of Michael's dreams, desired and needs and was by his side till the very end.
