Evelyn received her formal education in the Harrison County School District where she attended Starlight Elementary School in Woodlawn, Texas and the Dunbar Elementary School in Marshall after her family moved to Marshall, Texas. Evelyn graduated from Pemberton High School in Marshall in 1958. Evelyn attended Tyler Junior College and received her certification in Phlebotomy.
