And find an everlasting peace, together, with the Lord.

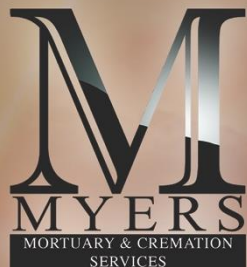
