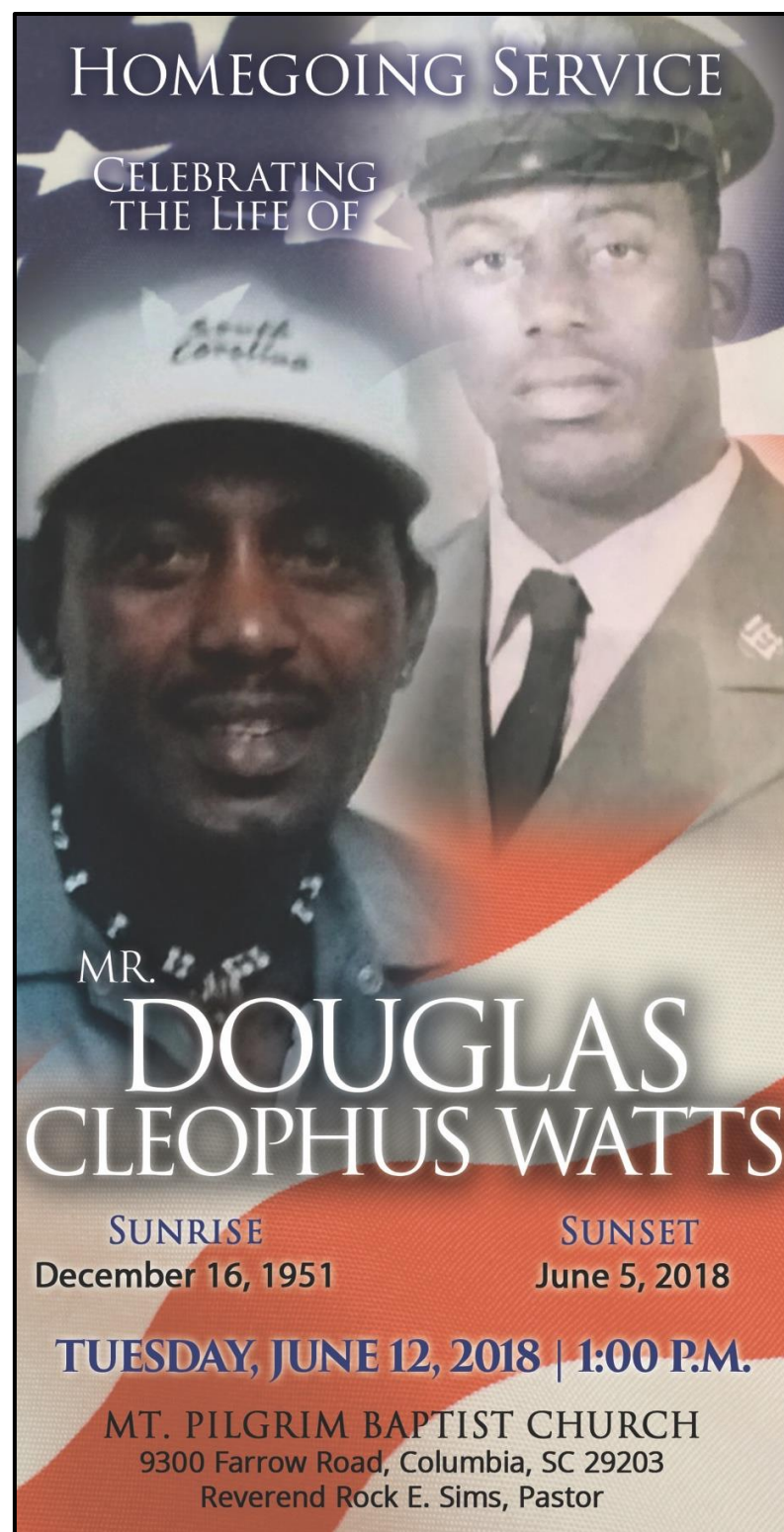

The Obituary

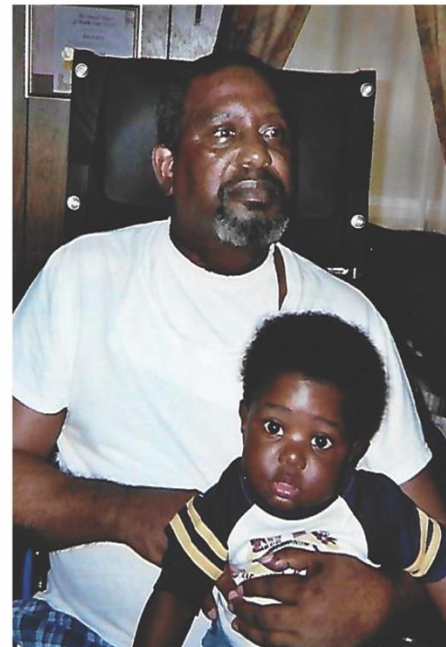
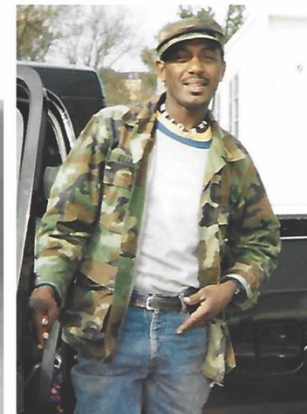
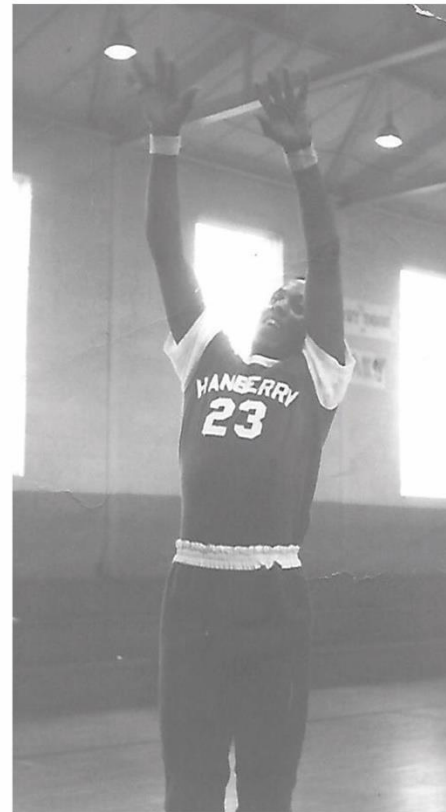
