

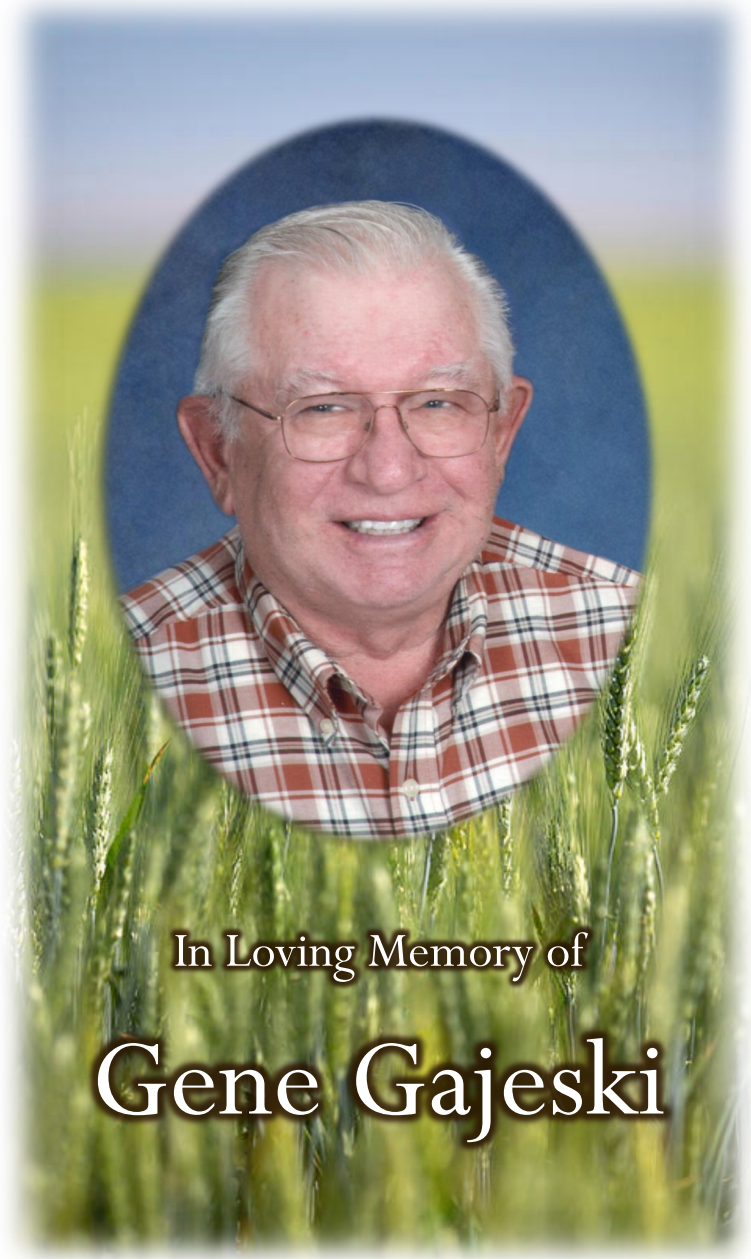
REMEMBER ME

Gene Gajeski, 77, of rural Stephen, MN, passed away on Tuesday evening, November 22, 2022 at his home with his family by his side.

Gene Allen Gajeski was born on July 23, 1945 in Drayton, ND, the son of Roman and Bernice (Janikowski) Gajeski. He was raised in rural Stephen and he graduated from Stephen High School.
