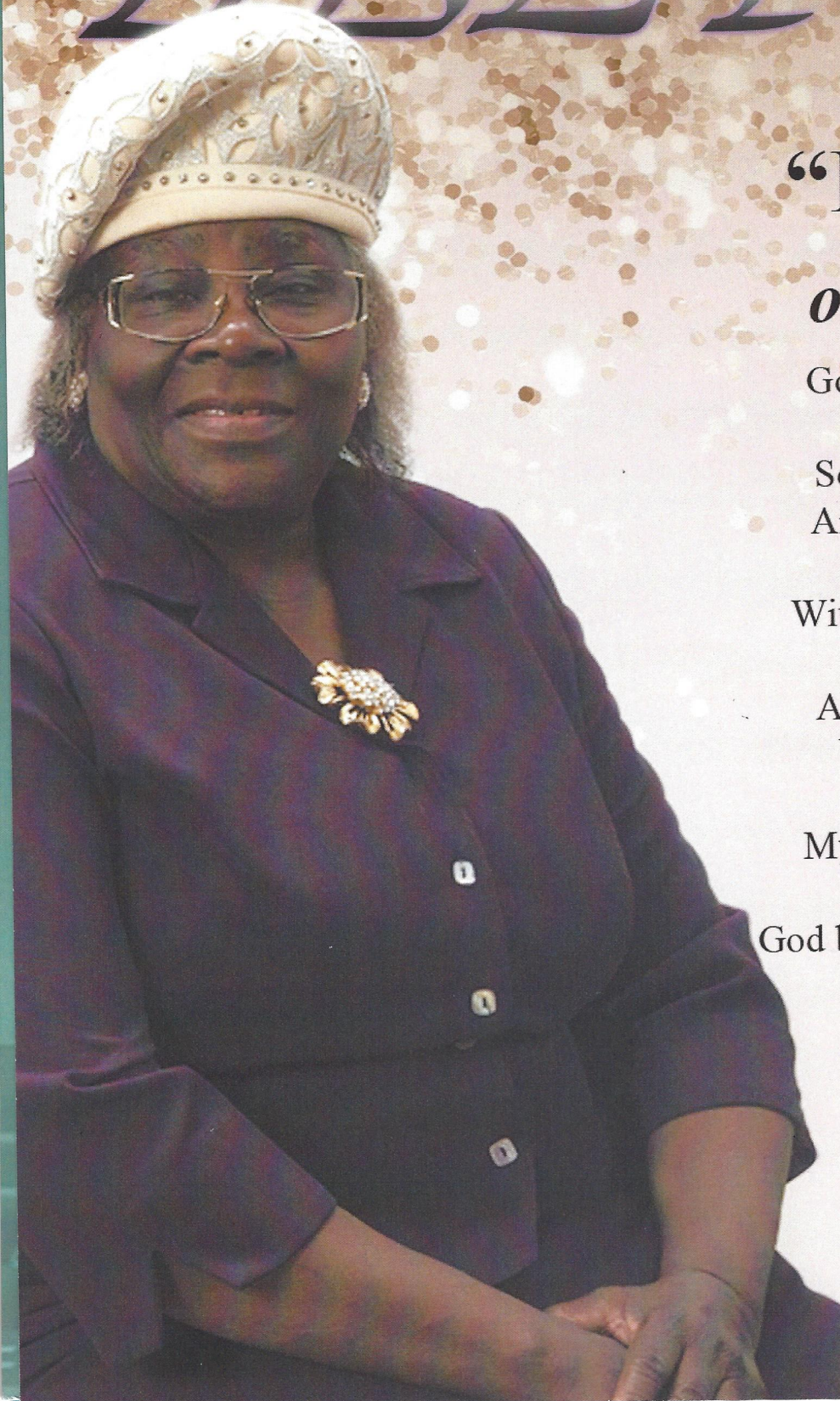

Legacy of Love

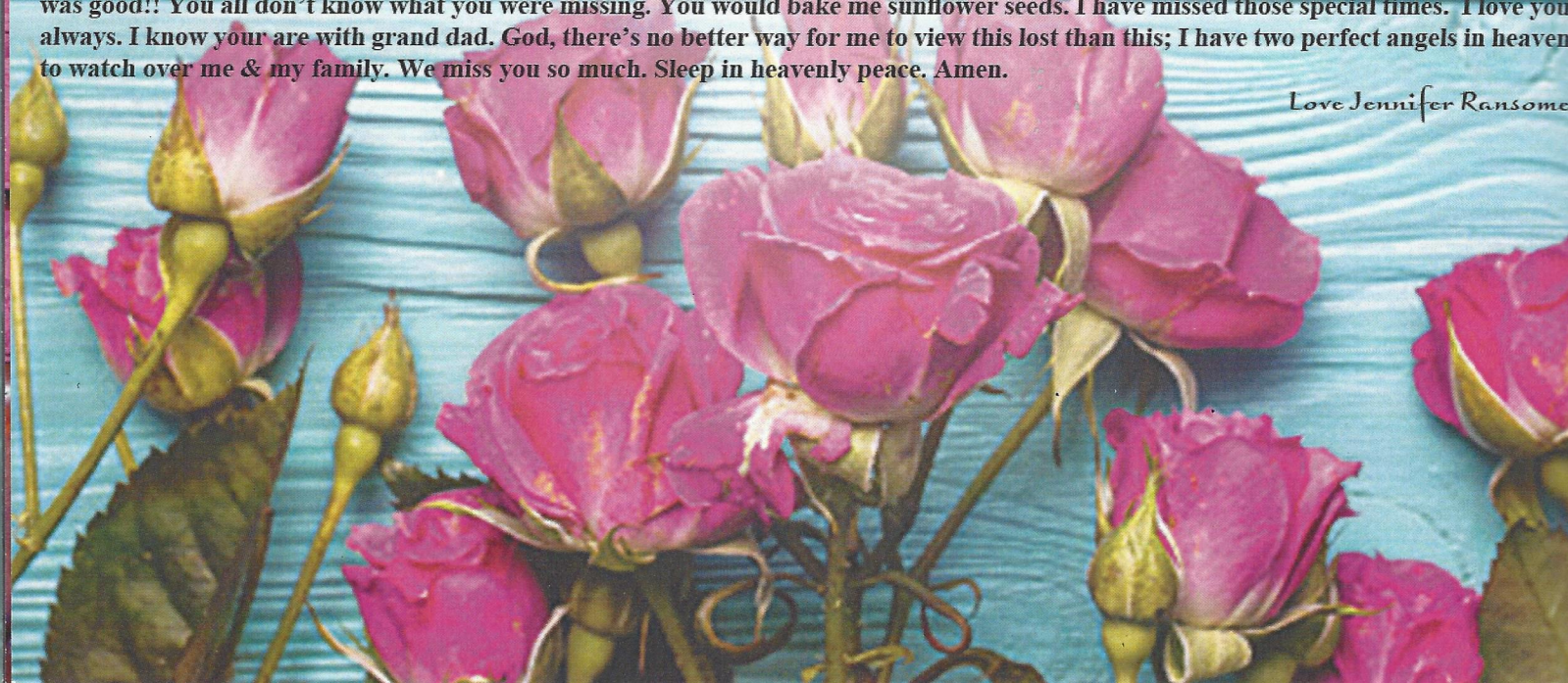
