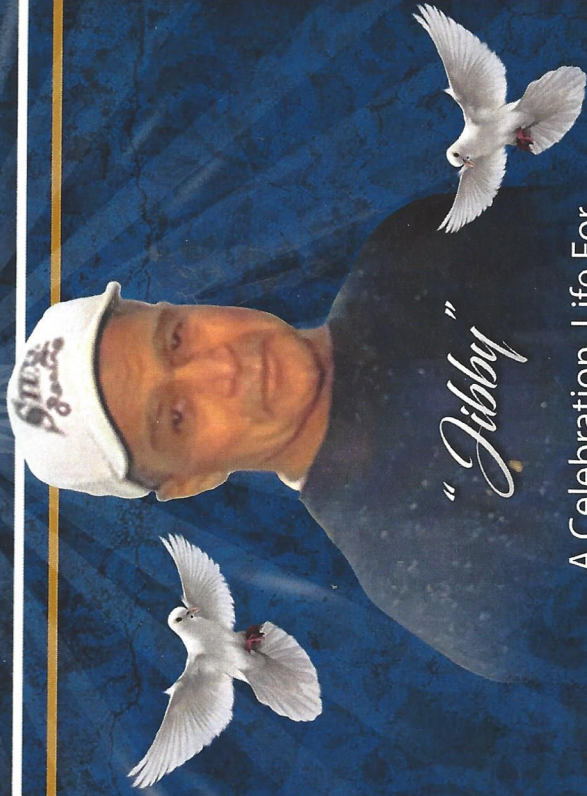

Thomas C. Williams Jr., of Hamilton, NJ, age 91 entered peacefully into rest on July 21, 2010 at Saint Francis Medical Center.
