She worked for Buttonwood Hospital as an independent Contractor Nurse Practitioner until the Lord called her home.

In 1980 she met and married Roger Armstrong now deceased. She then met and married Osai Tutu 1998. She had no children from either marriage. Being the eldest of 5 siblings she got the nickname of Mother Hen. She was an extremely compassionated and caring woman. Henrietta was a strict protective caregiver when left in charge of the home. This love continued as she was an essential part of the Village that help raise and shape us and many generations of the nieces and nephews who she loved so dearly.




























































WHEN TOMORROW STARTS WITHOUT ME
