And bury your sorrows in doing good deeds. Miss me, but let me go.

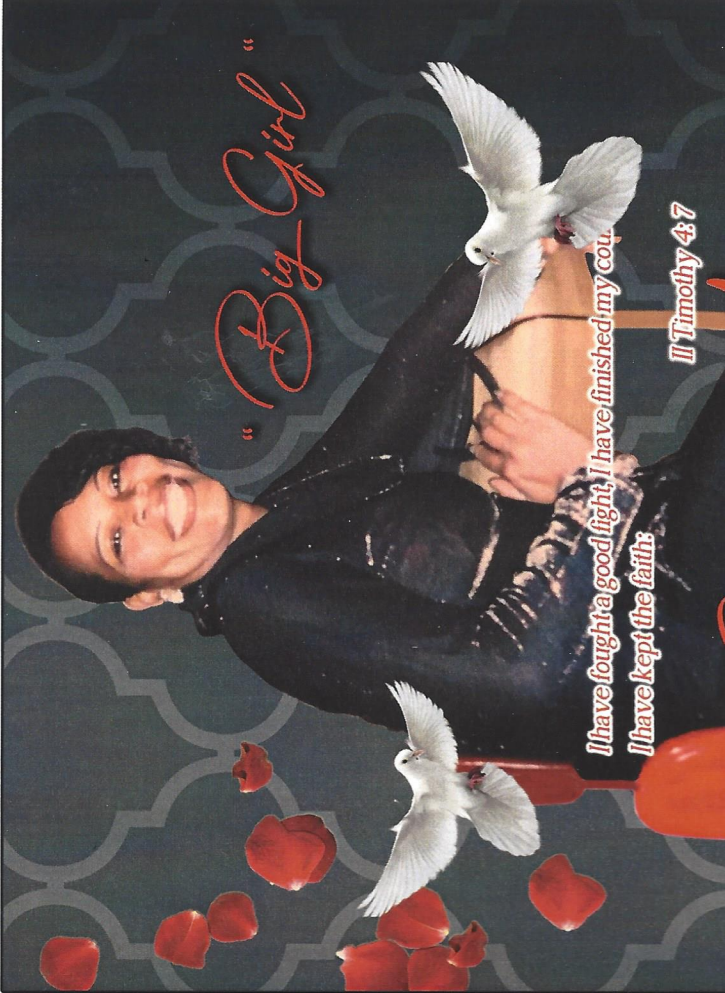
