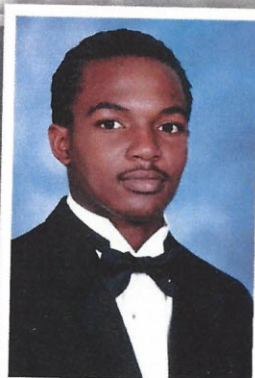

Deacon Roberson was educated in Mobile, Alabama and graduated from Mobile County High School. He attended Twenty Century Business College.
