Rose Mary Clark Williams, daughter of the late Johnie and Odell Towns and biological daughter of Kathryn Clark was born on June 16, 1952 in Wadesboro, North Carolina. On Saturday, November 20, 2021 Rosemary transitioned from Life to Eternity at ProMedica Total Rehabilitation Center in Voorhees Township, New Jersey.

Rose graduated from Trenton Central High School in 1971. She obtained her Associate's Degree in Computer Science from Mercer County Community College in the 1980's.

Rose was employed with the State of New Jersey for more than 30 years. She began as a Key Punch Operator, transitioned to the Taxation Department and then to the Department of Pensions. She retired in 2008 from the position of Computer Programmer in the Pensions Department.

Rose and her son Aaron were inseparable. After retirement, Rose relocated to South Carolina to live with her beloved son Aaron Clark and Daughter-in-law Nakisha. She relocated back to New Jersey in 2014 and married Anthony Williams on September 28, 2015.
