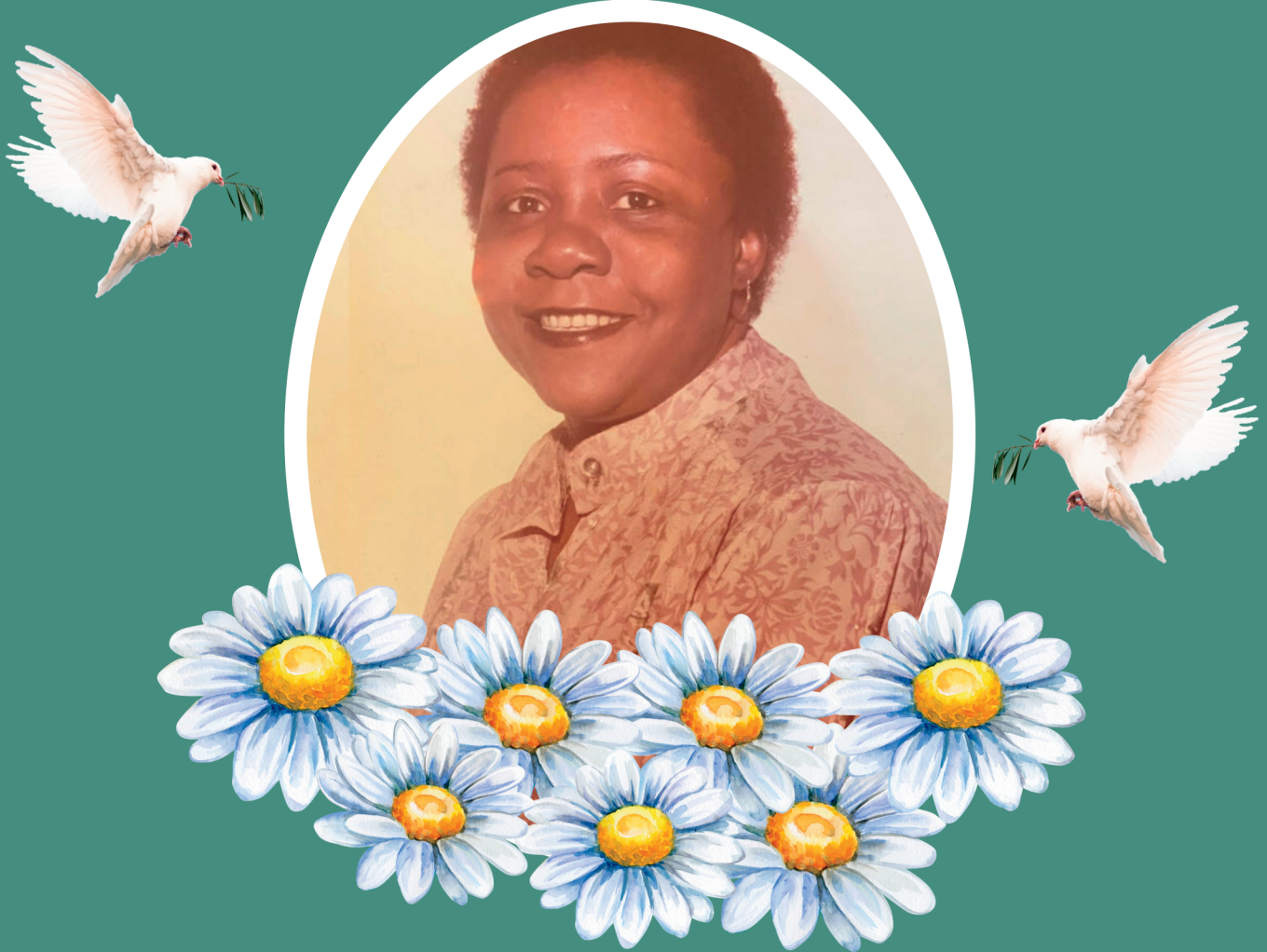

Obituary

Cadder “Solita” Jean-Louis (Joseph), 77, of Boston, MA, passed peacefully in her sleep on the morning of October 13, 2022.
