Mr. Roosevelt “Roe” Grant, the sixth of eight children, was born to the late Eugene and Agnes Grant. He was called home to be with the Lord on the 16th day July 2018.

Roosevelt attended the public schools in Lexington County. At an early age he gave his life to the Lord and joined Ferguson - Grant Chapel. Later he relocated to Queens, New York and worked in hospitality. Upon returning to Cayce in 1980 he worked various jobs. He started his own lawn service because he loved landscaping.
