Ginger Mae Moat Johnson was born October 9, 1953, in Amhurst, Texas, to Frank Moat and Nellie Farrow Moat.

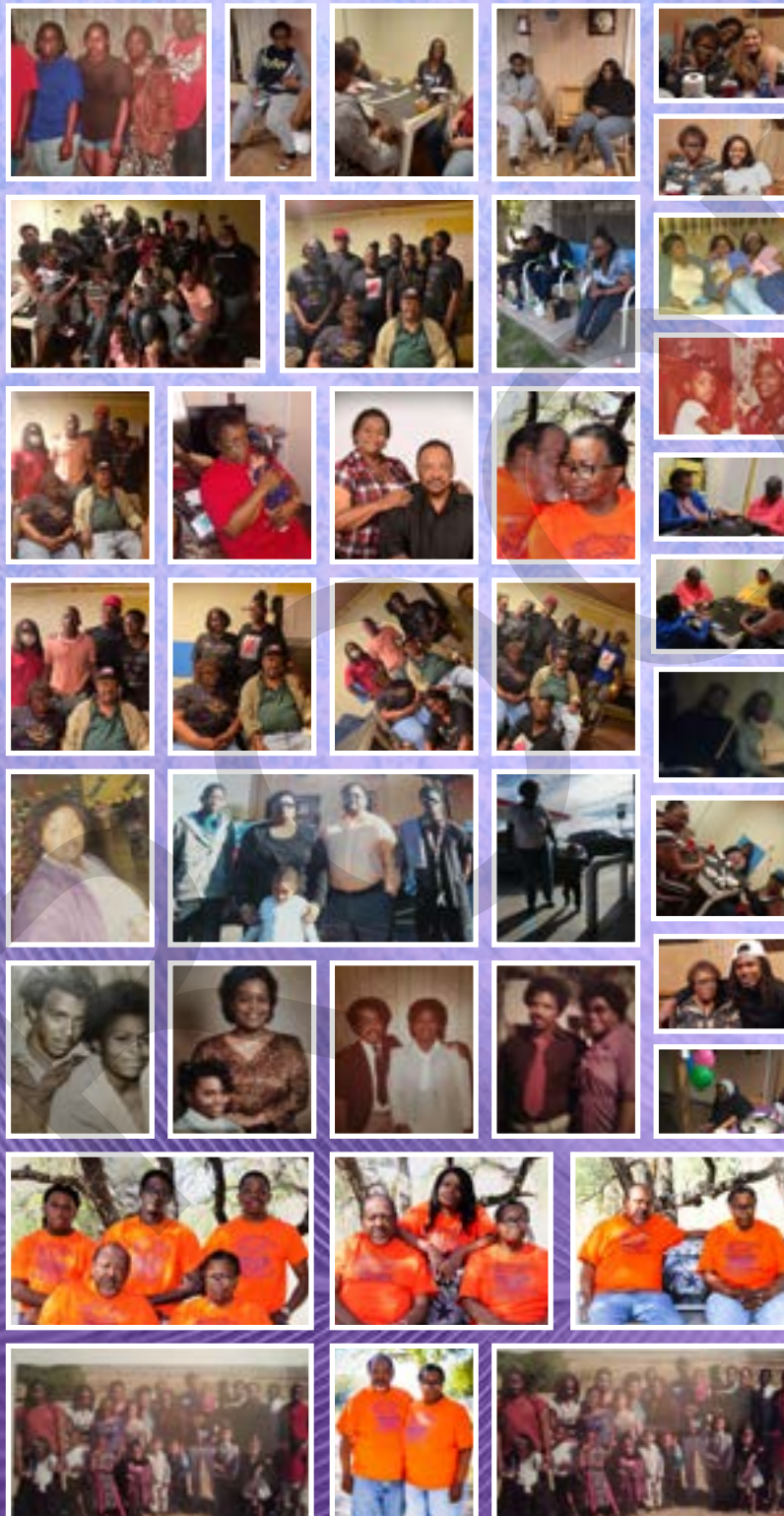
