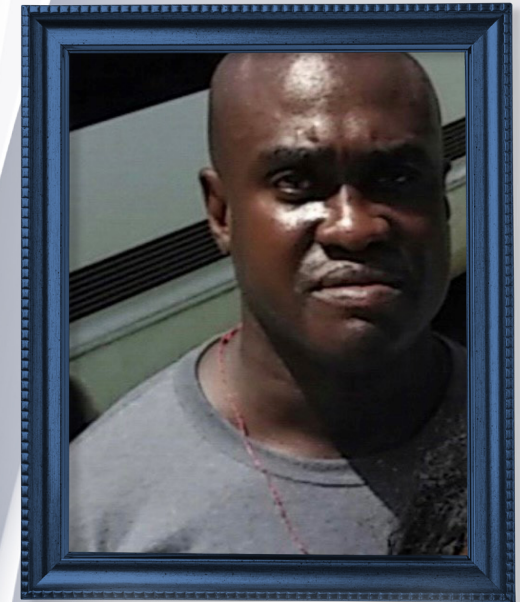

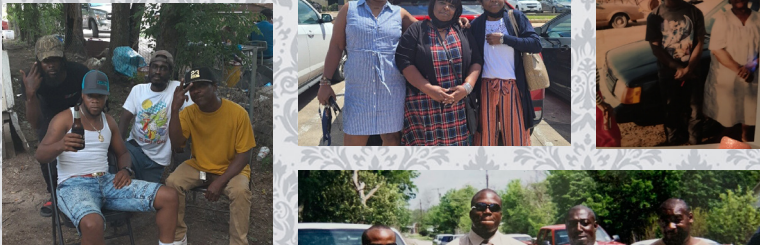
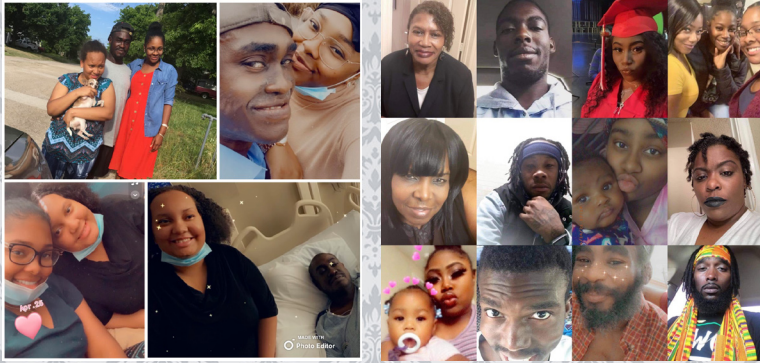
Obituary
