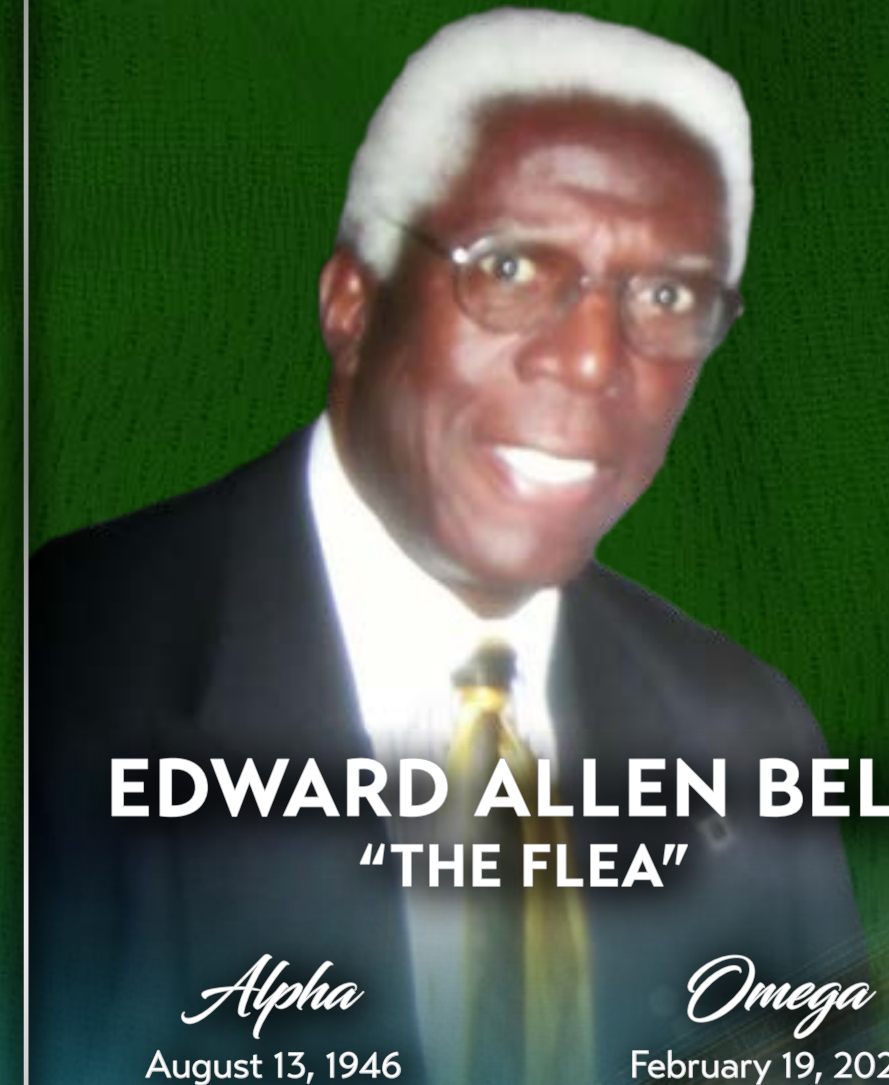

His Life Story

Edward Allen Bell was born August 13, 1946, to Hiawatha Bell and Juanita Delores Stokenberry Bell in Waco, Texas.

Edward accepted the Lord as his personal Savior. He grew up in Toliver Chapel Baptist Church. After moving to Fort Worth, Texas, he became a faithful member of The Potter's House in Dallas, Texas.

Edward attended J. Newton Jenkins Elementary School and G.W. Carver High School, graduating with the class of 1965. After graduating, he furthered his education at Idaho State University, where he was drafted in the National Football League by the New York Jets in the ninth round as a wide receiver. After his professional football career, Edward decided to pursue acting in Hollywood, California. He starred in the television daytime soap opera the Days of Our Lives. Edward Bell was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame.

Eddie the "Flea" Bell as he was affectionely called loved to travel, play golf, Broadway theater plays, community involvement and most of he loved serving in his church.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Hiawatha Bell and Juanita D. Bell; and sister, Brenda Bell Miller.
