




Reflections on the Life of Mrs. Cherry Scotton Marsh

Cherry Lynn Scotton Marsh was born October 24, 1956 to the late Jessie Lee and Lucille Scotton Currie. Cherry graduated from Jordan-Matthews High School in 1975 and went on to attend Dudley School of Cosmetology and became a licensed hairstylist. Although her spiritual beginnings and her start of her relationship with the Lord began at Rocky River Baptist Church, the Lord later led her to the Church of God of Prophecy (COGOP) in Siler City, NC where she gave her life to the Lord under the leadership of Rev. Marie Siler on October 18, 1981.

Cherry attended Central Carolina Community College in Sanford, NC and Asheboro Community College to enhance her marketability for continual gainful employment. She became employed by a number of different employers, where she also continued her course work studies at UNC-Chapel Hill to continue to increase her employability. Due to her experience and continual educational pursuit, she was offered a position at UNC-Greensboro as a contracts and grants administrator, It was during this time she answered the call of God in all its fullness to leave her job and go into full time ministry.

Cherry was called to Ministry in 2000 under Dr. Bruce Scotton Ministry and later accepted the calling to establish her Ministry.
