Muriel C. Barnett

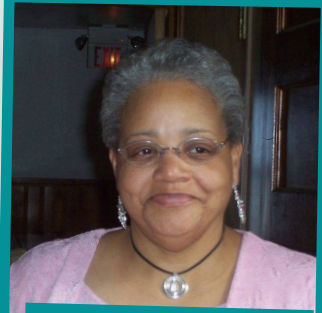
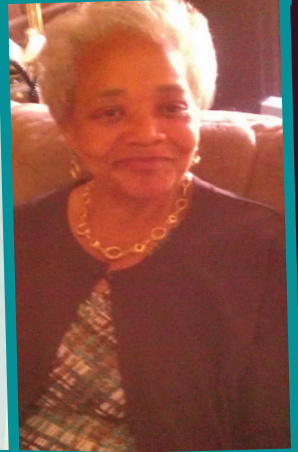
