Bishop Melynn Murphy, D.D., D.H., C.S.W. MT. SINAI HOLY CHURCH OF AMERICA, INC.

Founding Pastor of The Mt. Zion Full Gospel Church 1987 - 2016 Founder and President of The Spirit of the Lord Gives Life Ministries 2001 - 2021

Bishop Melynn Murphy was born on March 24, 1954, the seventh child of the late Melvin and Marion McDonald.

Bishop Murphy was a very bright student and had very good grades as she attended William F. Powell Elementary School in Camden, NJ. Bishop Murphy enjoyed art, drawing and children's games. She was a leader of her classmates, being selected a lieutenant of the school's safety patrol, a clarinet player in the school's first musical band and stepping well in folk dances like the waltz. While growing up, Bishop Murphy attended Mt. Calvary Baptist Church in the city of Camden, NJ and became saved at the early age of 11. While a member there, she expressed her love for music and started honing her leadership abilities as the director of the youth, junior and young adult choirs, as well as the Youth Revolution for Christ choir in conjunction with Bethany Baptist Church Association. Bishop Murphy continued to expand her love for music and singing at Pyne Poynt and H.B. Davis Jr. High Schools by joining the Glee Club Choir to begin her skill as a director of choirs. Entering Woodrow Wilson High School, Bishop Murphy's leadership qualities blossomed, when as a freshman, she was chosen to be captain of the W.W.H.S. Tigers Marching Band - Drill Squad for the next four years. She was very athletic playing softball, basketball, karate, gymnastics, roller skating, playing billiards, ping pong and loved bowling - which she learned from her father and later taught her children. Bishop Murphy was a member and student director of the W.W.H.S. Glee Club, a member of the Future Teachers of America and a member of H.S. Sorority-Sheka Phi Epsilon. Her love for people and a strong desire to see people grow led her to be a counselor at Camden's YMCA throughout her high school career, where she introduced many of her friends and other young people to Jesus Christ. Many visited and became members of her church as a youth.

After graduating from Woodrow Wilson High School, Bishop Murphy came north to attend Montclair State College, where she would meet several more believers and continue to grow into ministry over the next several decades. Bishop Murphy answered God's call on her life under the guidance of Bishop Leonard R. Williams and the ministerial staff of Zion Holy Church in Newark, NJ. While at Zion, she would serve in many capacities such as Choir Director, Minister, YPHA Leader and Evangelist. Bishop Murphy received her Minister's License under the Mt. Sinai Holy Churches of America, Inc. in September, 1977 and Evangelist's License from MSHCA, and September, 1979. She married in 1979 and then became the mother of three children David, Evelyn and Michael, who she always referred to as "her blessing".

While her work in ministry was always at the forefront, Bishop Murphy was an educator and Social Worker by profession with Head Start in Paterson, NJ. She would also collaborate with various individuals that worked with The YMCA and the Boys and Girls Club in Paterson. She would later continue working with preschool aged students as a Social Worker at the Children's Day Nursery in Passaic, NJ and then as a Social Worker at the Paterson Housing Coalition.



As directed by God, Bishop Murphy founded the Mt. Zion Full Gospel Church in Paterson, NJ, in November 1987. She served as the Pastor, where she demonstrated what it meant to live in pursuit of God's Higher Calling. She strived for perfection, preaching and teaching as directed by the Holy Spirit, the saving Grace of God and living a Holy Life.

Her endeavors in the City of Paterson were not limited to Mt. Zion Full Gospel Church. Within the city and throughout Passaic County and neighboring counties, Bishop Murphy served as a member of the Paterson's Pastor Workshop 1990-2001 (Chaplain 1997-2000), Chaplaincy Ministry at the Wanaque Convalescent Center in Haskill, NJ, weekly serving 100 HIV- AIDS infected adults, (1991-1994), Volunteer Chaplain of Passaic County Women's Center (Services to Domestic Violence/Battered families, 1997), Volunteer Chaplain at Passaic County Youth Rehabilitation and Detention Center, (1998-2008). During her time as the Pastor of Mt. Zion Full Gospel, she was appointed Presiding Elder of the Pennsylvania-New Jersey Diocese of Mt. Sinai Holy Churches of America, Inc., (April 2000-2009). In 2001, although heavily involved in ministry, she was never too busy to relish in being a stellar grandmother when her granddaughter Ariana was born. Adding to her fingerprint in the community, she became Vice President of the Board of Directors for the Dawn Treader Christian School, Paterson, NJ (2009-2014), among many other community and ministry leadership endeavors.

Bishop Murphy was elected to the Board of Directors of the Mt. Sinai Holy Church of America, Inc., in May, 2017 and was reappointed as Presiding Elder of the Pennsylvania-New Jersey Diocese of Mt. Sinai Holy Churches of America, Inc., in April, 2018 through her passing. She was also appointed Interim Pastor for Faith Tabernacle Holy Church, Port Norris, NJ in February, 2021 and elevated to the Office of Bishop for Mt. Sinai Holy Churches of America, Inc., in March, 2021. Bishop Murphy continued to work diligently for the Lord, even from her hospital bed by praying for others, providing 1 on 1 counseling and encouragement and attending formal Board Meetings remotely until she passed on December 21, 2021.

Bishop Murphy was preceded in death by her parents Melvin McDonald, Sr. and Marion McDonald, siblings Cheryl Morgan, Mark E. McDonald, Howard A. Morgan, Kenneth L. Morgan.

Bishop Melynn Murphy is lovingly survived by her three children, David (Nicole) Murphy, Evelyn (Desmond) Torruella and Michael Murphy; granddaughter Ariana Booker; brothers, her twin Melvin McDonald, Jr. (Cathy), Marvin Sterling (Carolyn) and Marshall Morgan (Tommi Dean); aunts, Ellen Lewis, Marie Hunter and Hattie Burch; uncle, Sterling Davis, a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, friends as well as co-laborers in Christ, fellow members of the Mt. Sinai Holy Churches of America, Inc, and The Spirit of the Lord Gives Life Ministries.
