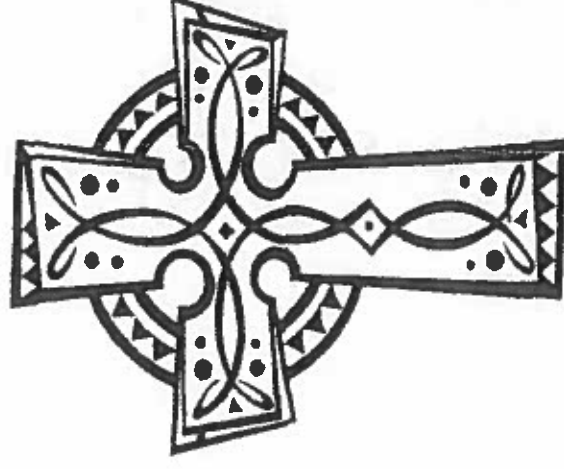

Introductory Rites (Please stand)

Paschal Candle

The Easter candle is a sign to us of Christ's undying presence, of his victory over sin and death, and of our share in that victory by virtue of our invitation.

Holy Water

The blessing with holy water reminds us of the saving waters of baptism a proclamation of the death and life into which CAROL entered through the waters of Baptism. The Community of Sacred Heart acknowledges CAROL as one of our own, as one who was welcomed in Baptism and who held a place in our assembly.

The Pall is a reminder of the garment given at Baptism and a sign of the life in Christ lived by CAROL.
