

OBITUARY

Anthony "Tony" Mangol, affectionately known as Jamaica by his friends, was born on September 3, 1953, in Jamaica, West Indies. He was the beloved son of James Mangol and the late Lois Jackson Mangol. He was one of six children. He was of Christian faith, and a member of Starke Church of God by Faith.

He married the love of his life (his queen), Shirley Fayson Mangol, on July 20, 1985. Tony and Shirley celebrated 33 years of marriage last July.

He was preceded in death by his mother, Lois Jackson Mangol, who loved and adored him and affectionately called him June. Cherishing precious memories of Tony are: his daughters, Mercilla Mangol Chambers (Kunta) of Houston, TX, and Gia Griggs of Starke, FL. He was a graduate of Morris High School located in the Bronx, NY. After graduating from high school, he worked for Simon & Schuster Publishing NYC in the mail room. Understanding that education was important to be successful in life, he decided to further his education by attending Friendship Jr. College in Rock Hill, SC. He completed his college education at his beloved North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University (NC A&T SU), Greensboro, NC, where he

earned a Bachelor of Science degree. He is passionately known by his Aggie family as the Ambassador of GHOE (Greatest Homecoming on Earth). He began his career working as a Drug Counselor at The Door in Orlando, FL. Tony later moved to North Florida where he worked at HRS as a Mental Health and Drug Counselor. He furthered his career by gaining employment at Santa Fe Community College as a Job Placement Counselor; he then moved to Florida Works where he served as the Manager for several years at Bradford and Alachua counties. After leaving Florida Works, he worked as a Counselor Manager for Job Corps of Gainesville, FL. He later retired from that same position in Little Rock, AR. He continued his community dedication serving as Precinct Clerk Poll Worker for the Bradford County Supervisor of Elections Office.

Tony had a heart of generosity. He provided countless volunteer hours, donations to many non-profit organizations, and community efforts for the betterment of adults and youth, including Special Olympics and Concerned Citizens of Bradford County Youth Basketball League.

He was best remembered for his love for his family, his Aggie family, Lawtey Baseball Cub's family, and his artistic ability to make and fly kites. The kites could often be seen flying high throughout the city of Starke. He loved photography, and captured many memorable moments with all who loved him. He also had a passion for music, and was a huge fan of Smooth Jazz. Tony found SeaBreeze Jazz Festival at its early inception in the year 2000. He, Shirley, family, and friends made it a tradition to attend.

He was a Board Member for several professional organizations: City of Starke Fire and Police Pension Board, Santa Fe College Bradford County Initiative Committee, Santa Fe College Andrews Advisory Committee, and Communities in Schools/ Take Stock in Children.
