I believe many of the best things in life are free: the splendor of a sunrise; the rapture of wide-open spaces; the exhilarating sight of your land greening each spring.


I believe true happiness comes from watching your crops ripen in the field and your children grow tall in the sun.

Celebrating THE Life OF JOSEPH "JOE" PATRICK SCHOEN

1924 - 2019

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Joe Schoen of Lethbridge, formerly of New Dayton, beloved husband of the late Mrs. RoseMarie Schoen, passed away at Chinook Regional Hospital, on Thursday, July 4, 2019, at the age of 94 years.
