

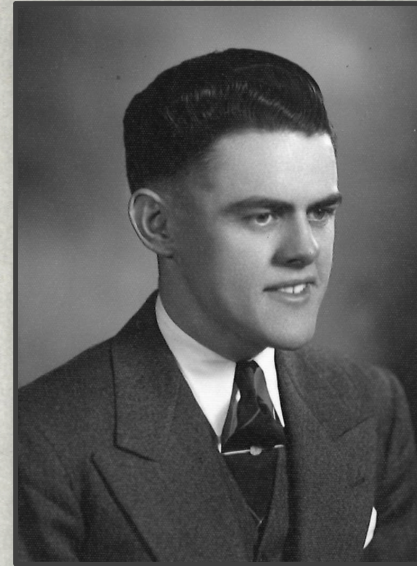
The Hogger's Lament
