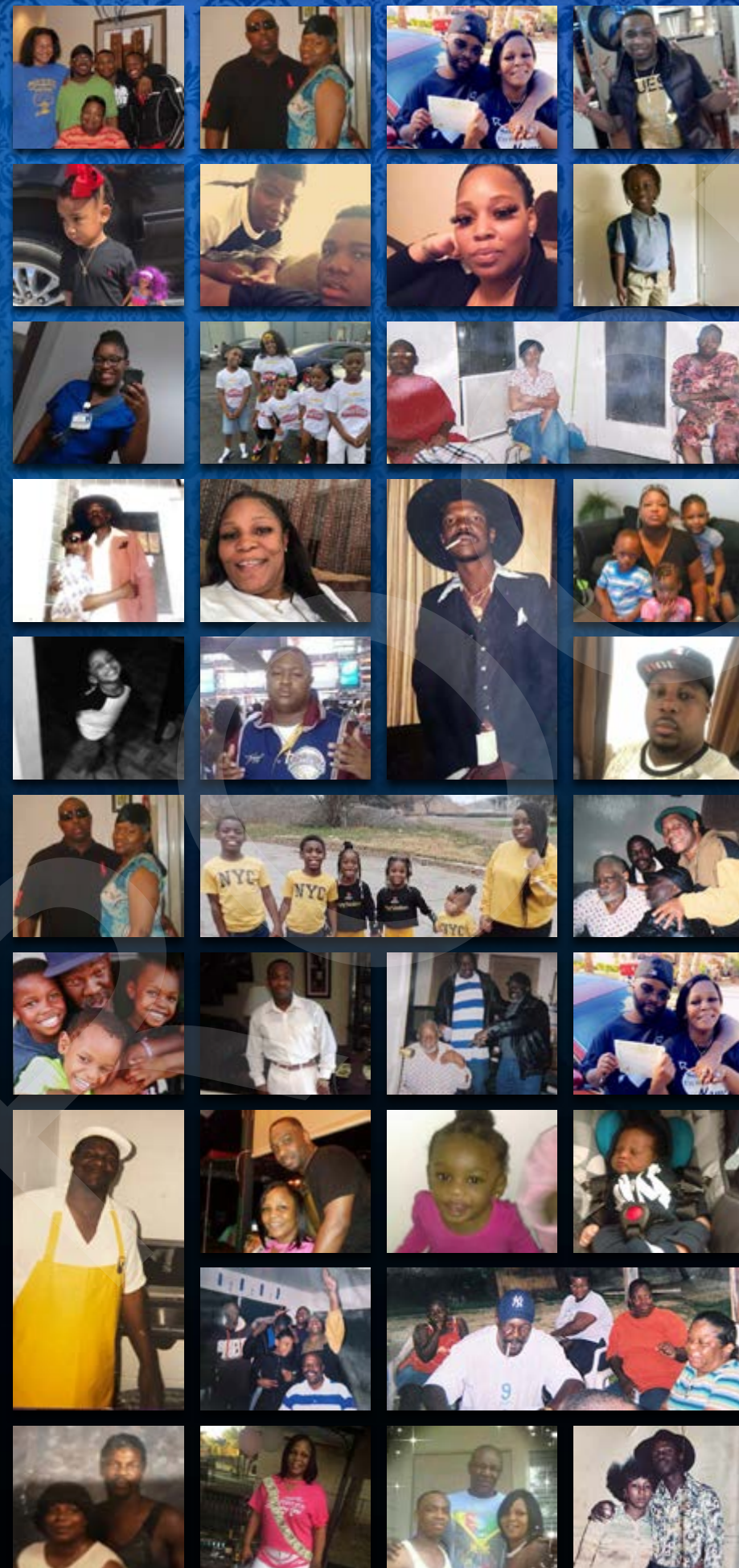
OBITUARY
