# LIFE REFLECTIONS

Lorenzo Zachary Chambers-Harris—affectionately called Zach or Zo—was born on December 22, 1987 in Houston, Texas to Delean Chambers and Randall Harris. Shortly after his birth he and his mother moved to St. Louis.

Lorenzo was educated in the St. Louis Public Schools and was of member of Gateway Institute of Technology High School graduating class of 2006. Later, he attended Prairie View A&M University receiving his Bachelors Degree in Architecture. Lorenzo gave his life to Christ at an early age and joined New Sunny Mount Baptist Church, where he served on the youth usher board and choir.
